It's important to read *Dark Legend* before reading this book, as this one is about Lucian and follows on more or less directly from the previous book.

Lucian's only reason for staying alive is Francesca's assurance that his lifemate exists in the world and needs him. He spends the next couple of years looking for her and finds her in America (surprise surprise), a police officer called Jaxson with a tragic past: her family was all murdered by her father's best friend, Tyler Drake, a fellow SEAL who trained Jaxx as a child and teen, who then murdered her foster family and even a wheelchair-bound woman Jaxx befriended. He is twisted and thinks he's protecting her, but will harm anyone she gets close to. As a result, she's isolated herself. Until Lucian comes into her life, takes over and doesn't listen to her warnings. Vampires have come to the city too, drawn by the promise of a lifemate, and it's in Jaxson's nature to protect everyone, including Lucian.

This one reminded me of *Dark Magic* in that Lucian is a typical Carpathian male, and a rather condescending one too - he's impressed by Jaxson's ability to figure things out, as if all women are stupid. Jaxx isn't a very convincing character, but her horrific past is all too real. There are some intense scenes here that I loved, which have given it a boost in star ratings, but the flowery prose and constant hit-me-over-the-head repetition (of descriptions, themes, adjectives, feelings etc.) gets really wearying. And why do all the women have to be so tiny? Seriously. How realistic is that? And Feehan really needs to learn - or at least picture - how bodies come together, because some of their feats are impossible, even for Carpathians.

This was the 3rd book I read in the series and after reading Gregori's and Julian's stories, this was a MAJOR disappointment. I can safely conclude that this series is going down the drain, because this was seriously shoddy work.

Having heard about the legendary hunter Lucian, with this amazing hero status as being one of the two most powerful Carpathian males, I was expecting so much. And boy did my expectations get shot all to crap.

His lifemate is a human, which I still don't understand how/why that happened because Carpathians should only be able to get with another Carpathian. That's just how it works, or so I thought, until Feehan said that males could make human women go through the change to a Carpathian, which shouldn't be allowed to happen in my opinion. Humans are just so stupid compared to Carpathians, and Jaxon was no different.

This was a great story and addition to the series. I liked both Jaxon and Lucian very much and enjoyed seeing them become a couple as well as partners.

Jaxon was born to a father that was special forces and he taught her those skills from a very young (almost as soon as she could walk) age. She took to it naturally and liked training better than anything else. Jaxon's father was killed early in her life and she lost the rest of her family and then her foster family. All this was because of a psycho that fixated on her and she ended up having to live her life pretty much alone outside of work because anyone she became friends with got killed horribly. Jaxon could never use her training in the special forces so she became an excellent police officer who's known to have uncanny instincts.

Lucian is an ancient Carpathian male; Carpathians are born vampires with abilities like shape shifting (to any form, even mist), magic spells and psychic powers. The males of the Carpathians have a darkness in them and if they don't find their lifemates, they can lose their souls and become evil. Lucian has a twin, Gabriel, and they hunted vampires together for centuries together but when Gabriel seemed in danger of losing his soul, Lucian faked turning vampire for centuries so that Gabriel would have something to focus on until he found his lifemate.

Lucian had planned to let Gabriel kill him once he'd found his lifemate and it almost worked but Gabriel and his lifemate convinced Lucian to live and that he had a lifemate out there now that needed him. Lucian believed them and held on for a while longer until he found her, Jaxon. Jaxon first meets Lucian when a police raid she's participating in goes bad. Jaxon and her partner are shot and Lucian comes in and saves them, sweeping her away to his home where he heals her. When Jaxon wakes up, she's actually a bit sad that she's still alive because she's just had such a trying life and it's hard for her to be the focus of so much death (from her psycho) and loneliness. When Lucian and Jaxon are first getting to know each other, she's attracted to him but wants to leave because she's afraid any connection could cause her psycho to kill again. Lucian won't be deterred though and makes it clear he won't be pushed out of her life.

Jaxon does try to push Lucian away, fearing an emotional connection. She actually found out what he was pretty early into things but had some trouble accepting everything, insisting on thinking of Lucian as human and trying to wish away the strange things that happen around her. Thankfully, that doesn't last although she does still go off at times but it seems more like Jaxon is the type to blow up about the impossibility of things just because her brain is having trouble dealing with it. After the initial blow up, Jaxon usually settled down pretty quickly and moved forward. I really liked that Jaxon had been tough all her life and wasn't about to be benched by Lucian and I loved that Lucian realized this and actually allowed her to help him when they ran into danger. In the end, they became a very good team and ended the story cementing their HEA.

I greatly enjoyed this story. I will admit that although her back story was compelling, I wasn't sure about Jaxon at first. However, as I got to see more of her and how she dealt with her transition and all, I found that I really liked her. She's a smart cookie with a lot of willpower and courage behind her. Lucian was a very unusual Carpathian male...they all want to make their lifemates happy but I'm not sure how many others would actually willingly work with her to fight vampires. Color me impressed. Overall, that story was really good and things stayed interesting enough that once I really got started, I didn't stop until I'd finished. I'd recommend this story. :D

Finding a lifemate was not the difficult part of his newest challenge, it was to convince a human woman to become a part of a new existence. Running most of her life from a monster, Jaxon Montgomery was not prepared to find out just what kind of evil creatures really were a part of her world, she had the street smart and special training to survive on her own, she would never be able to really depend on someone else for her safety, or let them try to take care of themselves without her help. Finding that each had a special gift for seeking out the monsters (human and vampire alike), they might be able to strike a balance between the two that allows Jaxx her own way to protect and serve while Lucian still follows his way of dispensing justice.

So we know of Lucian from Gabriel's story. He's held out and found his lifemate...Jax. He's been um...stalking...her for a while. He's entered her head enough times to know her sad history and all her furniture likes and dislikes! Sweet! Anyhow, as he's *trailing* her, he ends up saving her butt. She's a cop and there is an ambush by some drug lords or something like that. Anyhow, Jaxx is close to death and Luc has no choice but to give her blood and heal her, beginning the mate bond.

If you know this series, you know what to expect: an overbearing Carpathian male and a semi-feisty heroine who talks a big game but usually doesn't follow through to the end. I like the combination of Carpathian male and psychic human in these books the best. I'm never uninterested to see how CF will have the h react to having her life completely changed and taken over. I found Luc so arrogant as to be endearing. When Jax asks what he's done (concerning the initial binding) he says with a straight face, "I have forced your compliance only on the occasion when I was healing you, **binding you to me**, and when you needed sleep." Alrighty then. No big I guess? lol I kinda wish CF would take it even further. She often 'softens the blow' by having the h confused and wanting the H because of the other-half-of-your-soul factor involved and/or the H bending over backwards to compromise. Just once I'd like to see a "you crazy, I'm out" by the h and then have the H work for it or a H who says, "whatever, deal" and the h fumes but has to..err...deal. Sometimes CF walks the line too much and it loses some of the fun IMO.

Dark Guardian is the 9th book in the Dark series by Christine Feehan. This is Lucian Daratrazanoff and Jaxon Montgomery's book. Lucian is the older, darker one of the legendary twins, his people call him the Dark Angel. This book has an amazing prologue that gave an in depth look into both Lucian and Jaxon's history. The Prologue for Jaxon is just heartbreaking. It gave a good base for understanding all the pain and suffering Jaxon endured her whole life. It helped me to connect and sympathize with her.
