Another issue I had was in the beginning Austen's character did some things that confused me. And also gave no indication or reaction on why she made those decisions. This happened a few times. The biggest one of these was when she switched tables with the guys. They were being mostly respectful and hadn't done anything to warrant that reaction even if the woman was abused. The author should have made one belligerent or something also Austen didn't react or anything all of a sudden in the next chapter she'd switched tables with no indication as to why. That confused me a bit. Besides these two problems I loved this book.
