When selecting this book and reading the cover as well as the description my first impression was that this would be a comedy. First note. This is not a comedy! Sure it has some funny lines here and there but no more than a horror novel would have.

The novel is divided into two distinct sections running parallel chapter by chapter. One part is a book written by one of the characters from the other part that is entitled The Aliens Guide To Conquer The Planet Earth. The other part chronicles the story of the guide author and others connected to his story.

The guide examines shiny things, violence, countries, friends, sex, Earth, religion, commerce, information, and the conclusion. There are some anecdotal reviews of these things but in truth is not clearly a guide to conquer the Earth but more of a guide on how to control the Earth once you have conquered it. Although this is where you do find the odd funny line, too often the author attempts to be serious.

The other part of the story goes from unlikely to ridiculous with the author's use of extreme government actions making it unbelievable.
