Open Arms and Open Eyes was on the lower end of average for me. I just didn't have enough time to really connect with these guys and I didn't feel a lot of chemistry between them. It wasn't a story I'd pick out of a crowd, and it's hard to define what exactly was wrong with it. It was quite sweet, but I couldn't really relate to either of the guys, and it didn't really speak to me or evoke any warm fuzzy feelings. There's nothing really wrong with it, it's just a typical contemporary story about two young men and their love story that gets lost in a sea of other similar tales.

It's not a bad short story for a lazy summer afternoon, it's quick and easy to read and fairly uplifting. Other readers may relate to these characters more than I did. For me Open Arms and Open Eyes didn't really draw me in and make me care about its characters as a good romance should.

This is really cute and adorable, and that's pretty much all I can say about it without giving anything away, since it's only around 5000 words.

I do have a few nits to pick, namely:

1. Retelling of past stories through the characters' dialogue - this normally puts me off, and it kind of did here, too, but it was done in a pretty smooth and unnoticeable way so I can't really complain-

2. The "I'm not gay, I only love you" trope - people, it's getting old! It was sweet the first dozen times I read it, but try to find something else to spice your story up, because this ain't workin' no more. Or, hey, I have a better idea: *man up and admit you're gay*-
3. The transcribed vlog - could have been done way, way better. There's n way that 10 written lines could fill up a vlog longer than a minute, if that, and who actually says "i.e." irl? However, the youtuber thing was the main reason why I read this story and it's an interesting variation from the sea of monotonous M/M short stories out there, and for that alone it's worth reading--but, as you can see, none of these really bothered me, so. Yeah. Cute.

Open Arms and Open Eyes is an **extremely short** short story. Actually, I don't think it meets the requirements of the genre of a short story. For one thing, there is no plot. We have two characters, yes, and a setting, even a conflict, but sadly the "story" and the writing style has no effect on the reader.
