There were a few issues with this book that grated my nerves such as...

Poor Editing - I am not a writer and not the most grammatically correct person but when I notice typos, editing and grammatical errors then I know there is definitely something wrong with the book. Poor editing has never stopped me from finishing a book but I will take notice of it when it happens repeatedly.

Poor Characters - The two main characters in this book did nothing for me. Neither one captured my attention which really surprised me because I would have at least thought the rockstar in the story would have somewhat captivated me. For those of you who know me, than you know I love me some rockstars but there was nothing about Kip that attracted me to him.
