Reading *Under His Protection* is my first experience with a romance novel, so I must confess I have no other medium to compare it to aside from the classic fiction I love. Therefore, this review will be based on what I imagine a romance novel is supposed to be.

Sex: Yes, there is sex and plenty of it. The sexual tension leading up to Greyland and Alex's first encounter is consuming, and after that, Alex turns into a bit of a sadist and Greyland is his masochist, but not so much that it's chains and whips.

Unrealistic story line: Covered. Supposedly taking place in London before America's Civil War, the events, actions, and dialogue of the characters are all grossly inaccurate. But this is a fantasy novel, not a semi-fictional account of life during the 1800s, so romance audiences will probably overlook these details.

Attractive, well-endowed characters: Check and check. No romance novel enthusiast wants to read about an average man drooling over an average woman. This is fantasy, after all!

The happy ending: Woman is in trouble, man saves woman, man and woman get married and they live happily ever after. *Under His Protection* has all of these moments.

Based on these elements of the romance genre, I would give this novel five stars. However, there are mistakes that even an inexperienced reader could pick up on, like unnecessary misspelled words (intension was one that drove me crazy, along with what I'm assuming was meant to be town but was constantly referred to as ton.) and rough mishaps in punctuation that this novel was riddled with. If the author had used a proofreader before publishing—even a friend to read over it to pick up on these things—then the oversights would have been rectified. As an avid reader, writer, and English major, I could not let these errors go unpunished.

I don't generally give books less than a 3, but I guess there is a first time for everything. First, though- this story had a great premise, and the solution to the old historical mystery was well thought out and plausible. I did, for the most part, like the characters and those two things are what kept me reading.

The actual events throughout seemed disjointed, and some of the dialogue was, to be blunt, almost juvenile. There were also an embarrassing number of grammatical errors that made it hard for me to read without hitting my head on my desk.

In her book, Ms Von Haegert attempts to explain a centuries-old mystery regarding two youthful princes of York: their uncle imprisoned them after their father died and nobody knew, with certainty, how they had fared after imprisonment.

Ms Haegert's treatment of the mystery produces an intriguing plot that includes distant history, lust, love, gossip, humour, suspense and constant action. The story is set in London, England, in 1938 and it begins with a brutal fight between Alexander, the Duke of Ravenswood, and an American. Amidst the violence, and the prospect of more, Greyland Kingston emerges in the story. She is originally from New Orleans but is staying in London.

Despite Alexander's single-minded pursuit of his gaming habit, Greyland attracts him and they enter into a risky relationship that fuels gossip, jealousy and severe threats. He becomes consumed with protecting her and the mystery of the descendants of King Henry VII.
