Cast in Secret is the water/Tha'alani book and we get introduced to Evanton, the keeper of the elemental garden.

I really like the continuing importance of Sanabalis, although I miss Tiamaris (but these days I know he'll become important again).

Severn and Kaylin are really working a mystery here and following all kinds of clues, but the coolest bit is the history of the water and the Tha'alani, no doubt.
