She lives with her mother's voice constantly in her head, her dead mother's voice, telling her to keep quiet, not to tell anyone or they will all die. So Eleanor lives with her secrets and lies. Mitchell Sharpe spent a year under a hex. He woke up with no fiancée and no memory of his terrible behavior. The last year, the daily hex took its toll on him so he needed recovery time in Prestige Institute. It's there that a beautiful woman sits down at his table one day during dinner. Patients go to institutes to find their health, their sanity; Eleanor and Mitchell found love. Immediately the two face difficult challenges; Eleanor's unstable health, powerful witches, and an ancient curse.

I enjoyed the first book of the Wards and Wands series. I loved this one. Obviously, I wasn't a fan of hexed Mitchell in book one but regular Mitchell is awesome. He's intelligent, charismatic, and loves a good puzzle. Eleanor is a complex soul with her secrets and her 'events'. She's intelligent, funny, and sweet. I fell in love with these characters individually and together they were adorable. I also love Kim and Stefan. Much more of their personalities came through this time. However, as much as I enjoyed Eva and Lawson in their book, I no longer care for Eva. Most of the story is told from her viewpoint, and getting in to the head of someone who seems crazy was a different take on a romance. I think the story

would have been even stronger if we could have gotten into Mitchell's head throughout the book as well, but we do get a little of him near the end, which I thoroughly enjoyed.

I wasn't sure where Rebecca was going to take Mitchell's story since he had been hexed for an entire year in the last book and then spent a year in a mental institution trying to come to terms with what happened to him. This is where he met Eleanor, and she was just such a fun delight to read. She is probably one of my favorite recent characters that Rebecca has written.

While most of the first half of the story revolves around their budding relationship in the mental institution, it is when they both leave there that things really pick up. We get to see Lawson and Ava, and Stefan and Kim from the first book. We also meet Trident and Sebastian, a very unusual couple who play a pivotal role in the story, even if they don't have a lot of time on the written pages.

The progression of Eleanor and Mitchell's love story is totally believable for how they met, and the expectations people have for the crazy half-witch Eleanor. I simply loved them together. As with most of her story's, Rebecca knows how to write wonderfully sweet interactions between the two main characters.

There was only one glitch that I felt in the story between chapters 12 and 13 that seemed to jump ahead somewhere in between the chapters and off page. A tale of witches, goddesses and cults, good against evil, redemption, lives salvaged from the mess created by others and the power of true love...

I missed 'Hexed and Vexed', the first book in Rebecca Royce's Wards and Wands series, so I really didn't have much idea about the story I was about to read but I've been a fan of her books for years, she's one of my favourite authors and never been disappointed so I had a pretty good idea of how good I expected the stand alone 'Curse Reversed' to be and it certainly lived up to expectations. This author has a pretty varied repertoire, and a fair few of her books are set in unusual locations with slightly off the wall characters, but I really wasn't prepared for this one....at all!

At first I thought I'd misread it, but no... it's definitely a mental health facility and the heroine of the story is definitely a patient, which kind of threw me at first, but as I settled into it, I was at first fascinated, and then completely engrossed in this tale of witches, goddesses and cults, good against evil, redemption, lives salvaged from the mess created by others and the power of true love.

Eleanor St. Vincent is a sad creature who, at the grand old age of fourteen and on the day of her mother's funeral, was deemed to be 'nuts', her word, not mine, and has spent most of the last ten years in one mental institution or another, but what's wrong with Eleanor can't be cured by therapists. This particular one is

called 'The Prestige Institution' and is where she meets fellow patient Mitchell Sharpe. They seem to hit it off and have a positive effect on each other which leads to them becoming friends. The first one Eleanor has ever had, but he's about to be discharged and she thinks she'll never see him again. Eleanor suffers from what are referred to as 'episodes' where she does and says things over which she has no control, never remembers and according to Mitchell rants in the ancient dead language of Alurmic. Something he knows a fair bit about, being an expert on Germanic Runes.

The unfolding story is a roller-coaster ride of puzzles and clues as he tries to work out what happens to 'Ellie' when she has an 'episode' but his motives aren't particularly clear until much later in the book. By the end of the book, a few other characters have joined in the 'fun'. Eleanor's grandparents, who don't really know her, ex-Enforcers Stefan and his wife Kim who are hired to be her 'baby-sitters', Mitchell's ex-fiance Ava, and her new husband Enforcer Lawson Abramowitz, as well as Alurmic experts Sebastian Nadal and Trident O'Shane, who all try to help Ellie 'get better', but have very little in the way of ideas about what is actually wrong with her. But not everyone is exactly what they seem, some have a more selfish agenda and there's a major sting in the tail for them as well as some serious plot twists that I really didn't see coming. And just when I thought there was a happy ending in sight, a new twist ripped it from my grasp, but there is a happily ever after.... eventually.

Despite it's somewhat depressing beginning, and the strange location in which the story begins, it had me totally hooked from beginning to end and I read every word like a starving person devouring food. Filled with wonderful characters, magic, mystery, mayhem and a growing love story it also had bits of humour and a ton of steam. And I really want the house cleaning spell. I simply have to have it! I absolutely loved this terrific story and have no hesitation giving it 5 well earned stars. I'll read it again, probably quite soon, so it's gone onto the 'read again' list. It's also earned a place on the 'rescue if the house was burning down' list and I only put the best of the best on that one.
