I was given a free copy of this book by the author in exchange for an honest review.

As the name of the book suggests the plot is about light and dark - in this case, of human nature. Maggie Tideswell begins 'Dark Moon' by introducing her protagonists and although the reader meets 7 characters in the first 10 pages there is never a feeling of being overwhelmed. Maggie Tideswell gives her reader fragments of information about the characters- which is enough to know that they have secrets and to be excited about the story that will unfold.

I found that once I started 'Dark Moon' I was compelled to continue reading and following genuinely fearful moments, sadness and romance, I had unknowingly finished the book several hours later!

Maggie Tideswell deals with the subject matters of rape, the occult and witchcraft, amongst other things, yet she is sensitive in her approach. The pace of her writing means the reader never has time to dwell but we still have time to experience the emotions of the characters.

All those in 'Dark Moon' are intense and remarkable. Trevor and Elle represent the dark and the light - they are both self-serving and in my view untrustworthy, but Trevor's evil is from where the story originates. Storm and Jarred are also damaged but seek comfort in each other and often the banter between them provides a light-hearted release from the rest of the story. I found it impossible not to become attached to these two and I loved the way in which Maggie Tideswell wrote their story, yet wound it so cleverly with everyone else's.

This plot is dramatic and the subject matter is heavy but 'Dark Moon' is an excellent book with a story that draws its reader in and holds them there.

I would definitely recommend 'Dark Moon' and look forward to reading more of the author's work.

Jarred can't forget Storm either. He's been searching for her since their meeting on the beach. He knows she's the one for him. To add to the fun, Elle and Sybil are witches. Mystical, loving and a bit strange, this book weaves through story lines like a snake. I did find the story thrilling and a true attention getter, however, it does start out a bit confusing. The story is one of good vs evil. Love vs hate. The writing style is definitely unique. You'll enjoy this one if you are a fan of fantasy. I thought it was difficult to dig into at first. There seems to be a rush to get all of the characters in the story and let you know their place. The basic story is a true love story.

I did find issues, those listed above and the fact it didn't make much sense at first. It didn't explain that there were murders happening. It didn't explain why Trevor was so difficult. It was hard to keep all that straight.

“Well, my girl, I hope that boyfriend of yours is ready to make an honest woman of you. Congratulations. Everything looks fine so far.” Though he smiled, there was hesitation in his voice. Biting her lip to save her cheek, Storm lost the battle with the tears that had been threatening all day and doubly so after Trevor’s rebuff. Andrew pulled her head down to his shoulder, rocking her from side to side, as he had done many times before. He let her cry, and then, after what seemed like forever, he said, “There, there, it’s not the end of the world. You’re going to make yourself ill. Come on, chin up. Trevor seems a good sort. You’ve been dating him for long enough. Why aren’t you on the pill?” “It makes me ill, and as there was no reason to suffer, I didn’t bother.” Calm washed over Storm. “Uncle Andrew, it isn’t Trevor’s,” she mumbled hoarsely.

Storm Fenton has just had confirmed what she and her best friend Donna had suspected – she’s pregnant. Problem is, she has been dating Trevor for almost a year and he isn’t the father. Actually she didn’t even know the name of the baby’s father. Her pregnancy is the results of a ‘rape’ that wasn’t exactly a ‘rape.’ Maybe it’s best called ‘consented rape.’ But to Storm’s surprise, she will soon meet her mystery man and when he discovers her situation, she can’t seem to shake him. When she finally tells Trevor that she’s pregnant with another man’s child his attitude splits. He assures her that she will never have the baby while assuring her that she belongs to him and he will have her through marriage. His motive as well as his actions come from deep within and he seems sincere when it comes to wanting Storm for himself and does all in his power to keep her away from Jarred, the baby’s father?

Storm is a psychologist who tries to help Elle, an attorney, find a murdering/rapist who has killed 7 women already in a ritual fashion. Elle also turns out to be his 8th victim and the only one that was spared her life. But Elle’s life is not only disrupted by the rape but by the appearance of her birth mother who inform her not only that she is a witch but that the murderer is her own son, making him Elle’s brother. The two must band together to destroy him before he kills again and before he performs his final ritual that will give him the powers he desires.

So, who is the killer - is it Trevor or is it Jarred? Or is it someone else entirely? Who is really looking out for

Storm's best – Trevor or Jarred? And which will end up with her in the end – Trevor or Jarred? Dark Moon is one of the most unusual books I've read. It has everything – murder, rape, witchcraft, fear and even love. And it left me with a feeling that there just might be a book 2, I hope.

I cracked open my e-reader with great anticipation for this book. The setting in South Africa and the merger between romance and the paranormal held much appeal to me.

I started reading and was hooked by the opening handfasting scene (no, I won't share details; you'll just have to read it). With great joy I kept reading and soon got confused. I had trouble figuring out who the main female character was going to be and which female character would be the featured woman in the handfasting ceremony. It took several chapters for me to finally figure out who was who. But by this time any emotional connection I may have developed with or for the heroine was not going to happen. Unfortunately by the end of the book I still had not developed care or concern for the heroine.

Same thing with the antagonist. I was unable to connect with him. He was flat and underdeveloped and even though I was supposed to hate him (which I did despise his actions and treatment of people), I just could not work up intense feelings one way or another for him. Like the heroine, I found his motivations and actions contrived, inconsistent and confusing.

It's interesting that the characters I most enjoyed were the hero, the best friend, and the hero's mother (although her use of servants riled me, but at least she got a rise out of me). The hero was classic romantic interest with the good looks, a heart-breaking background, and an interesting life. Of all the characters, he was the most developed. The best friend was also well developed. She had strong motivations, conflict and at times I loved her and at other times, hated her. So true of real people, right? And the hero's mother--well, let's just say she was the classic grand dame.

The main storyline had holes in the plotting and timeline and I felt two of the subplots, the paranormal practices and the homicide investigation, were dropped and picked up willy-nilly. But I do feel the overall story was rich in action and detail. It just needed to be orchestrated, woven together better because in the end, it felt like the author had bitten off more material than she could handle in one story.

Some additional aspects I enjoyed were the author's flair for description, her creativity, and bringing the story full circle. Overall, I thought the story okay.
