Great beginner explications if you've never attempted a sock pattern or never knitted, there is everything you need to get started. Although I would recommend *Stitch 'n Bitch: The Knitter's Handbook* as a true beginner knitting teaching guide because there is lots of simple patterns and ideas and sock yarn is very thin and time consuming.

My favorite pattern is the Up-Down Spiral sox on page 113, but that is for an intermediate level knitter. At the moment, my favorite sock knitting book is *Op-Art Socks: Creative Effects in Sock Knitting* and my tried and true is *Around the World in Knitted Socks: 26 Inspired Designs* as my family members have

received many socks from that book through the years.
