Finding Bliss is a spin off book from Dina Silver's, *One Pink Line*. It can be read as a stand-alone.

Life has been hard for Chloe Carlyle, who grew up without a father and lived with an alcoholic, mentally unstable mother. Growing up like this has shaped her life to be ambitious, successful, and determined to build a better life than what she was given. She wants to be like the Reed's, who have status and wealth. The Reed's hired Chloe to be their nanny during the summer, while vacationing at their summer home. Once the summer is over, Chloe will be off to law school. She's always had a crush on the Reed's eldest son, Tyler Reed, the star quarterback for Notre Dame. When he shows up that summer, Chloe's crush grows to a whole new level. Chloe falls hard for Tyler's charm and good looks.

But this love story is forbidden by his parents. They would never approve of Chloe and Tyler being together. And Tyler lets his parent's dictate how he lives his life. He must be the best of the best in football. He must marry a girl within their social status. That doesn't stop Tyler and Chloe from forming a friendship that turns into a summer fling. A fling that ends when summer is over.

Chloe is devastated when they part ways at the end of the summer. She goes to law school and Tyler goes back to Notre Dame. They try to stay in touch but the distance is hard for them. Chloe still thinks about him and has never gotten over him. He is the one boy she wants but can't have. Lots of time goes by before they see each other again. But then Tyler contacts her one wintery night, pleading to see her again, and everything changes on that one fateful night.

Fate works in interesting ways. After that night, a lot of things change between Chloe and Tyler. They become a couple and eventually get married. They never thought they would be THAT couple who couldn't get pregnant naturally. I felt poor Chloe's frustration and heartache as she desperately tries to become pregnant. Infertility is hard on any woman who desperately wants a baby. It's painful not to be able to have a baby when your friends and family are getting pregnant left and right. I also felt Chloe's pain when things start to crumble and she thought she failed as a wife. I admire Chloe for everything she endures as she tries to remain strong and determined throughout the story.

The first problem I had with this story is Tyler. I really liked Tyler in the beginning. But, as the story progresses, I just stopped caring about him. Unfortunately, I never fell for Tyler as my hero. He really didn't have much page presence during the story - which made it impossible for me to feel like I got to know him. This was frustrating for me since I'm a romantic at heart and the hero usually makes or breaks a book for me. Don't get me wrong, Tyler did NOT ruin the story for me, he just didn't make me swoon like the heroes I generally read do.

The second problem I had with this story is Tyler and Chloe together. They never really struck me as true love. The chemistry felt off. Neither one of them really fought for one another the way a couple in love should. They both worked too much and spent way too much time apart. The author focuses a lot on Chloe trying to get pregnant and, in the meantime, the stress takes a toll on the marriage. It was very sad and frustrating to read as it happens. But, in reality, this happens in marriages all the time.

If I was to choose the true hero in this story, I would say it's Chloe's best friend, Cam. She met him while in law school. His quirky humor, hot nerdiness, kindness, and loyalty to Chloe made me fall for him. Am I hinting around to a love triangle? No. There is no love triangle. But both Cam and Tyler's characters play an integral role in this story.

I would like to mention that this book reads more like Chic Lit. There is some romance, but it's more about Chloe's journey to figuring out life, falling in love, heartache, disappointment, friendship, marriage, infertility, betrayal, and life-changing decisions. This story portrays just how messy, complicated, and unpredictable life can be. I shed some tears and my heart went out to Chloe. One of the things I like most about Miz Silver's writing is how I can relate to her characters. She writes them deeply flawed and genuinely real. I definitely connected with Chloe on an emotional level. Now I know I've mentioned that I didn't like Tyler and thought the relationship lacked true love chemistry. I still liked this story. I think the author wrote an honest and touching book about real life challenges.

Finding Bliss is a book that leaves me struggling a bit to find the right words to express my feelings. It is one woman's journey towards finding love, maybe, but more importantly, finding herself.

Finding Bliss is not a love story. This is something that I had to continually remind myself while reading. Women's Fiction is a genre that I typically enjoy, but as a romantic, that is something that I always struggle with. Sure, there is usually romance in some form, but it is not the focus. Finding Bliss is a "big picture" story. It is not a romanticized account of her life. It was sometimes sweet and romantic, but also sad and troubling. It was real.

This is the first book of Silver's that I've read, and I really liked her writing style. It was very clean and inviting. I was immediately pulled into Chloe's head. I don't know if this was intentional, but Chloe was the only character that I felt drawn or connected to. There were several secondary characters: Chloe's mom, best friend Grace, the Reed family, Tyler and Cam, but I never felt as if I knew them. Grace was more of a sporadic character. Chloe's mom, who was not mentally stable, was a strong influence into her personality and choices.

There were two men in Chloe's life, Cam and Tyler, but Finding Bliss is not a love triangle. Cam is a long-

time friend and apparently had feelings for her, but I never felt that. I mean, I was told that he did, but I never got that sense of longing or sadness over an unrequited love from Cam. Tyler was...Tyler. I liked him and felt sorry for the position he was put in by his family. He seemed like a nice guy who genuinely cared for Chloe, but he also makes bad choices sometimes. I just don't know how I felt about him. Maybe it was the romantic in me, but I didn't want to believe that he could be selfish and just wrong. (Okay, at this point maybe I'm over thinking this!)

There were quite a few moments that I truly enjoyed Finding Bliss, and was so invested in Chloe's life. But at other moments, I felt as if I was missing a true connection. The ending left me hopeful, yet puzzled. I think I can see what the author was going for, but I didn't feel it. As I mentioned before, Finding Bliss is a realistic story. This is the story of a life, the good, bad, and ugly.

This book is a spin off, but *not a sequel* to Dina's fabulous book, *One Pink Line*, which I have read and would recommend to mother's and daughter's everywhere! So I was excited to read *Finding Bliss*.

There was so much about this novel that I loved. I absolutely adore Dina Silver's writing. I read this book in one evening and I couldn't put it down, so that tells you a lot about how I felt whilst reading the book... Which is why I couldn't give it less than four stars.

However, there was also things that didn't work for me.

I like to spend an entire book falling in love with my hero to then have everything come together, idealistically, at the end. That, for me, is what reading romance is about. I want it to build and build, ready for the crescendo. And when I fall for a character, I fall hard!

That doesn't happen in this book. I can't explain why, without giving major plot twists away, but I can just tell you, you don't get to spend the 285 pages falling deeper and deeper in love with Chloe's knight in shining armour. And that disappointed me.

Finding Bliss is about the ups and downs of Chloe's life and how she manages to wade through the crap life throws at her to find happiness. It is no idealised, starry-eyed romance. This is about real life trials that so many people, all around the world, are dealing with. And for me, it was about how everybody's happy-ever-after is different, as is their journey.

This book was a lot more than I bargained for. The blurb doesn't give away just how much happens in Chloe's story. She deals with some awful circumstances and I really felt for her.

"Your mom is like the Titanic: if you stay with the ship, you'll go down too. Those people who clung to the boat ultimately perished. You need to get yourself on a lifeboat and get as far away as you can."

I liked her character. She was true and real. There was no 'Oh, he's really hot, but I don't think I should be with him because of some lame ass promise I've made to myself to be an independent woman.' etc, etc... She had her hesitations for like, a split second, and then she got the hell over them and took what she wanted. And what she wanted was sex with the hunky, childhood-crush, football superstar!! I loved that.

"She's just a girl."

"What am I?"

He leaned to his side and ran a hand through my hair. "You're a woman," he said and then kissed me ear and left his mouth there. "A gorgeous, smart, fucking sexy-ass woman."

I wasn't entirely sold on Tyler. I'm not sure why, but even at the beginning, he just didn't do it for me. I just didn't feel that connection between him and Chloe and I wanted him to sweep her off her feet and bow at her

feet.

"All that I know about happiness, you have taught me, and everything good in my life can be traced back to you."

I loved Chloe's friendship with Cam. *I* want to be friends with Cam! He's sooo damn cute *and* he supplies stuffed crust pizza, in times of need. What more does a girl want?

"Just click your heels together three times and say, there's no one like Cam, and I'll appear."

There is a big part of the book where Chloe struggles to get pregnant. She goes through many trials, tests, bloodtests etc. and it is excruciating to read her pain throughout the whole ordeal. Now, I have no experience of any of this, but I imagine that this will hit close to home for people who have been through a similar experience, so I felt the need to note it in my review.

Once Tyler did his job, a nurse would take Tyler's sperm, wash them in the spin cycle, give them each a spritz of cologne and a tequila shot, and then load them into a turkey baster that would eventually be inserted into my waiting vagina. So this was how babies were made.

Parts of this book moved so quickly that it made my head spin. But it worked. Sometimes, I'd begin the next chapter and it'd say 'Three months later' and I'd be like, 'Hey! What? What happened to [insert situation A here].' But it *did* work. So much happened that it was necessary for the author to skim over parts that just weren't essential to the plot, even if they might have been cute to read about.

The first thing I will say is that the cover is deceiving. This is a very emotional journey. So for her childhood, I have little to say. The fact that her Mother is there and an alcoholic is just so sad. Her babysitting job for a while was taking care of Sammy and Sarah, they were the Reed family twins. Of course she knew "of" and saw pictures of their oldest, Tyler, who was away at Notre Dame on a scholarship. She always thought he was cute and blah blah but never met him. When she does she is (in my opinion) in love with the ideal boy, the person she thinks Tyler is, the person his parents want and insist he be.

I will say that there is not one but several tough subjects discussed in the book. ALL of them are eye opening. I saw some other reviews of the book and I will say it saddened me that people wrote "this involves cheating" and "coming from a broken home". I will say that Chloe has issues at home, but although the same as discussed in other books, she is so real to me. Her character and her relationship and future are what brought her to life. Quotes like:

"For once in my life, I'd felt like the luckiest girl in the world. I'd enjoyed every last minute of it, and given the chance would've done it all over again. How can you be taken advantage of if you're a willing participant?"

She was in my mind and didn't leave, even now a week after I read it.

For the issues of course her Mom being an alcoholic, but then later on in life had issues with mental health. Chloe didn't judge her or become bitter either. Somehow she managed and used her friend Sydney and Mom Grace to fill the void. What I loved was the message that things for Chloe didn't start out great, but she was so determined and focused to find her passion for school and practicing law. Everything about her education was realistic. People don't know what new grads taking the bar are up against. 80 hours a week and that is the norm.

Then Sammy and Sarah in my opinion were heartbreaking too. Dr. and Mrs Reed were awful parents. When you read the book, and I HOPE you will, listen to the sub-plot and their dialogue. I wanted to take a hammer

to his hands and rip her voice box out. SO there! Tyahahhhh smack, crack, break, DONE

Another quote:

"I burst into tears as they took her away to the psych ward, kicking and screaming obscenities at me and everyone around her. To say it was the lowest point of my life would be a grandiose understatement."

It explores all aspects of marriages and grown up life. Yes for both Tyler and Chloe and his parents, marriage is not easy and it NEVER is. I took away from the story, a big reality check. Many people I know and love are divorced and not once but a lot of them twice over. I am lucky and not one of them, but like Sydney and Grace, I was the listener to many people going through so many similar issues.

"Though she liked Tyler a lot at this point, she'd always remained a little skeptical of him. I think she thought I was more invested in him"

The mental illness that went on in the Reed household was there and it was powerful. Putting pressure and unusually difficult expectations on children is what hurt me for all of them.

"We were both excited for the opportunity to prove to ourselves that we knew what good parenting looked like, despite our lack of examples"

The mental beating Chloe took from the Reed family in order to collect her \$20 an hour was just painful. Her financial issues were her own and her Mother was evil when it came to that part. You would think she would resent it but no she didn't.

I really have to say bravo to Dina. This was a great book. I felt so strongly about the issues and I urge all my pals to read it. Maybe it will open your eyes.

This book...tore me up. FINDING BLISS is realistic story about a woman who is making her way through life. It's not always pretty, but she learns to appreciate the joy that comes out of the journey.

Chloe has managed her life carefully. She's had to deal with an alcoholic mother and also work her way through school. The summer before she starts law school, she goes to work for the Reed family as their nanny. Even though, Chloe went to school with their oldest son, they never really knew each other. Dina Silver's *Finding Bliss* is an emotional read that sort of sucked me in right from the beginning. In an effort to be as spoiler-free as possible, I am opting for a list-type review rather than a full-blown description and discussion. Hang on, dear reader, because here we go ?

What I liked:

*The first third of the read which details the journey Tyler and Chloe take toward one another and their life together. This journey is not by any means a traditional one and makes the first third of this read particularly enjoyable.

*How decidedly different Tyler and Chloe's individual situations are. These two come from totally different places/backgrounds and I applaud Silver for using the backstory of each character to inform every decision (both obviously and not so obviously) each makes in their lives. This is a nice bit of consistency that ties

beginning, middle and, end together.

*Tyler: even though he pulls some pretty crappy moves throughout the read, he is by far the most fully-developed character. From start to finish and based on some very specific events, Tyler completely changes. It is a credit to Silver's writing ability to be able to convincingly change a single character so completely over the course of a single read.

*The overall writing style. This is a very smooth read (even as an ARC) which is carried by good dialogue, fine pacing and, tight editing.

What I didn't like:

*Chloe. For myself, Chloe was only a likeable character in the first third of the book. While I respect her fierce determination, this quality also makes her somewhat cold and hard to relate to. I appreciate that Chloe experiences some seriously awful things in her life but as the story progressed, I found it increasingly more difficult to root for her.

*How the plot evolves. Once Tyler and Chloe finally get together, their story begins to read like a biography rather than a novel. While there are certainly still big events occurring, the last two-thirds of Finding Bliss doesn't have the same feel or level of excitement as the beginning of the read.

The Bottom Line: Let me be clear, I never once considered DNFing this read!! Silver is a fine writer and from a technical perspective, Finding Bliss is a well put together novel. I was totally sucked in by the first third of the novel and kept reading because I just knew everything was going to come full circle at the end and finish with the same level of appeal as it began with. Unfortunately, this did not happen for me and I found myself being slightly disappointed with the read as a whole. With this being said, I can honestly see Finding Bliss appealing to readers who like emotional reads that focus on only a few characters and their journey together in this life.
