Fairly slow-paced, and somewhat predictable. Most characters are well drawn, but the woman preacher, who figures prominently, is rather two-dimensional. The author has a tendency to dwell at length on minute details that do not move the story forward. Since this was her first book, I'm expecting better from the rest.

2 (short story): The Lifted Veil. 2016-01-10. 2 stars

Somewhat interesting but depressing.

Pro: The characters are drawn with deep understanding of human nature and the countryside they inhabit.

Con: The author persists, to the end, in throwing insuperable obstacles at the characters, finally painting the story into a corner from which there is no escape.
