This was my first paranormal romance novel, and I was pleasantly surprised. Denise Moncrief is an excellent writer, and she does a wonderful job describing the many eerie things that happen at Laurel Heights. The mystery behind the mansion and the twists and turns along the way kept me wanting to come back for more. After running from her deranged ex, Laurel finds herself inheriting her dead aunt's property, Laurel Heights, in Arkansas. However, she isn't alone there, and she hasn't slept soundly since she moved in. Laurel hires a carpenter, Chase, to help her with some repairs; but Chase isn't all he seems to be, either. Laurel's ex's half-brother, he was sent to Arkansas to find her and the flash drive that holds her ex's financial codes. A hardened ex-cop, Chase doesn't believe in the paranormal; however, Laurel begs him to stay with her in the old house as she's deathly afraid of being alone at night. I received this book for an honest review.

This is my very first book to review, so here we go!

I liked the premise of the book. I could compare the story line to Kristen Ashley and her Ghosts and Reincarnation series, with the house that comes furnished with ghosts and secrets.

At times I felt that some of the internal dialog could have been shortened. I want to lead to the conclusion, not told about it a couple of different times in varying ways. Having the reader come up with their own conclusions through out the read is half the fun.

As I was reading along, it surprised me that all of sudden that Laurel and Chase had feelings for each other. I was taken aback at the level of possessiveness of Chase so early in the book.

Laurel has gone through hell, that is apparent, but her willingness to let her walls down so easily around Chase, (Rand's brother), not knowing the connection, subjected to neglect and abuse at the hands of the people that should have protected her, left me confused.

There are many questions that are left unanswered by the end of the book. I would have like to know how Laurel and Rand got together. What is going to happen to the house? Is Rand involved in the murder of Angie? What about the bank codes? Will the bad guys get to Rand in jail, or is he available to act out his revenge from the comfort of a cell? Chase still owes his brother, I am sure this thought was not lost on Rand. At the end of the book all the branches of Laurel's family tree are revealed. Can someone just turn their back, without the possibility of knowing the other's side of the story. What about Celeste's story? Why was James kept and not Laurel?

Laurel and Chase were on the run before they met, they will continue to run, until their pasts' catch up with them. Maybe all the loose strings will work their way into the second book, but in the end the boy got the girl. The questions left hanging are not enough to make me feel the need to read the second book in the series.

Laurel was running from her past, from a terrifying childhood to a dangerous boyfriend whose shady business dealings could cost her her life. As if destined, an aunt she never knew leaves her an old, rundown

home outside a small town who claims the house is haunted. Is it or is someone out to fill a contract she fears her incarcerated ex has placed on her. How did he find her?

A hired handyman who doesn't believe the town's ghost stories is almost too good to be true, private, not much of a talker, he doesn't ask questions Laurel doesn't want to answer. Is that because he hides his own secrets? When a man is killed near her home, the police take a particular interest in Laurel and possibly Chase as the murderer, which makes no sense, until his identity is revealed. Meanwhile there are thumps and bumps and creaks at night, is it the just the old bones of an old home, or is there something or someone else in the house with Laurel? But can you bump into a ghost?
