I've read a couple of other Dr Fell stories in anthologies but have found them bewildering because I hadn't been reading the books from the start. So I bough this first book in the series to at least try them and get a better idea of whether I would like them. John Fell is a Dom without a sub, his sub having died in a gay bashing 5 years previously. John needs some time and space to finish his thesis so his friend Ben offers John the use of his house whilst he's away at a conference for two weeks. There's a catch though in the form of Ben's sub, Charlie, who's a former druggie and one of the worst subs John has seen. John promises to 'train' Charlie in Ben's absence.

This was one of the more brutal BDSM books that I've read, not because John uses whips and paddles, but rather because he trains Charlie through humiliation. John doesn't love Charlie or even particularly respect him so his callous treatment made me wince a little. Having said that, I also found it quite a fascinating look at how the 24/7 D/s lifestyle is supposed to work and John's grief and sense of loss over the death of his sub gave him a sympathetic edge to the hard exterior. I've bought the TQ Chasers which follow on from this story and I'm still interested enough to want to read those.

I had some difficulties with this book. Not because it is D/s but because of the lack of emotions on Dr. Fell's side. After 5 years he is still going through the motions. I had the feeling that everything he does he does because of Rob's memory and because he knows that Rob would want it for him.

He didn't care for Charlie on an emotional level but I think even if he wanted to he couldn't because he grieves too much. He seemed to be still in shock and rather clinical about his and other's feelings. Maybe that was the author's intention. But it made it hard for me to connect with Dr. Fell.

But I am still curious enough to read the second book. Maybe with a little purpose in life he grows on me. But I liked how he disciplined Charlie and made the boy work and think about his actions. There was one scene where I was very uncomfortable because Dr. Fell slapped Charlie and it was not mentioned where. Back, butt or thighs is fine with me but as soon as it is above the neck it feels more like abuse to me. But maybe I just read it wrong.

short stories, usually they leave me eager for more. So when this morning I read that it's starting a chaser series on Dr Fell, I took the chance to read also the start point, Petsitting.

John is a post graduate student (I think it's late twenty-mid thirty, maybe more). After the death of his lover and pet, Rob, he took a leave from his studies and he chose to move back home to take care of his mother, fighting cancer. Now he is again alone, and he needs time to finish his thesys.

Ben has the perfect solution: he has to go out of town for work and he doesn't want to leave alone his pet, Charlie, a young guy just out of a detox process. John can leave in his house and complete his thesys and meanwhile take a look on Charlie. But when their cohabitation starts, John realizes that Charlie is not at all a good "pet": he is spoilt and lazy, and he needs a firm hand, just like John.

When Ben returns home he almost doesn't recognize Charlie and the new life of John as Dr Fell is starting...

In less than 20 pages, Syd McGinley decipts a whole universe, where D/S is not only a life style, but it's a necessity to survive: for John to give a meaning to his life, now that he is without Rob, and for Charlie to have something to live, something that preserves him to fall again.

Even if there is sex, this is not a love story. It's a journey of two men that temporarily choose to walk together along the path, helping each other.
