Awara Masiha by Vishnu Prabhakar- The book is a literary and biographical fiction of the most renowned Bangla author – novelist and short story writer, Sarat Chandra Chaterjee. The author Vishnu Prabhakar has travelled to Bengal, Bihar, Burma and Jabalpur Madhya Pradesh, where the author lived during his life. For a period of 19 years the author has collected magazines and interviewed people of Sarat Chandra's time. Sarat was brought up in the house of his maternal grandfather. He spent his childhood in dire poverty. During the period when he wrote novels (1976 to 1938) - 1857 revolutions was over, Permanent revenue settlement of Bengal by Lord Cornwallis (agricultural lands) (1873) was in force. The Zamindars (absentee landlords) were forcing the raiyat, to pay revenue of the land being cultivated by them. The situation of riyat who were exploited by Zamindars and situation of high caste young widows of rich and poor in society was pitiable. Freedom movement was at its peak. Young men were attracted to join the movement. Sarat went to Burma and started writing novels and short stories on the above situations. His women characters are young widows, frustrated and unloved young wives of Zamindars and young men committed to bring freedom from the British. Sarat Chandra is the author of the famous books " Palli Samaj, 1916, Sesh Prashna, 1929, Bad Didi, Devdas, Nishkriti, Srikant in four parts from 1917 to 1933, Parineeta, Pather Dabi, Bipradas and Shesher Parichay, published posthumously. It is a worth reading book for all.
