Although we've now sworn off Konrath's (Ms.) Jack Daniels novels due to excessive brutality, we enjoyed the prior novella, "Floaters", featuring Jack and introducing Chicago newspaper reporter Alex Chapa. Chapa is really almost more an investigator than a journalist, but nonetheless added interest and movement to a reasonably interesting plot.

Much the same can be said for "Burners", about a man being tried for arson and murder whose case seems almost too open and shut, suggesting maybe something is amiss. Chapa was tapped for jury duty; and while he was planning to lie about his inclinations to convict to be thrown out as a juror, he changed his mind partially because Daniels was to be a witness. Between the two of them, the courtroom drama is not only entertaining, but takes a really fun twist that makes the otherwise relatively short tale worthwhile.
