Eh. The book started out all right text-wise, but then the rest was rather clunky. And I didn't expect it to all come together the way it did. So then I had to look back on it. It's good that it ties in cars and dinosaurs--two things kids especially boys love. And you can work in colors (using both dinos and the cars) as well. Not my favorite, but it will hold a place for others.

9/18/13 This book went well because I focused more on a color activity I came up with rather than the text. I actually found the dinosaurs used in the book in colors that they were portrayed. So I printed and cut them out and taped them on the whiteboard. I also printed and cut out little squares of different colors. So when the text said "Green dinosaur in his truck..." I pointed to the different dinosaurs asking "Is this the green dinosaur?" When we got the right one, I asked the kids what color his vehicle was. They told me, and then I held the dino over each square of color until we came to the right one. Worked really well and the kids loved the activity (barely caring how some colors were a bit off from my printer). By the time the dinos were introduced, we were ready to focus on what exactly they were doing in the pictures. Went really well--yay!

After reading the story we enjoyed sharing the pictures and labels of the types of Dinosaurs on the inside cover. Of course I stumbled my way through the pronunciation of the Dinosaur names whilst miss 5 laughed at my silliness and pronounced them with ease. Turning to the back inside cover we were able to discuss the different types of transport used by the Dinosaurs and compare and label their size, structure and use.

Dinosaur Zoom! by Penny Dale is a simple yet entertaining read which uses a topic that all children become fixated with at one stage or another in their early years. I will admit that at first glance my thoughts turned to of "not another Dinosaur theme" but those thoughts were soon forgotten as we found ourselves bouncing to the rhythm of the words from page to page.

This is a book that definitely shows an understanding of the world of children's literature, laughter and the magic of sharing. Dinosaur Zoom! by Penny Dale is a book worth considering when building a book shelf of quality books for any child.
