This volume involved a lot of dialogue between Kurapika, the Royal family and bodyguards of the Kankin Princes. Some readers might feel impatient and demand there be more action. For myself, a part of me did feel that there was A LOT of talking going on but I appreciate the careful pacing these past couple volumes. I am confident that Togashi has major things in store for this storyline and won't leave us disappointed.

Kurapika, the Princes and their guards are all in a twisted game of cat and mouse. Now that the existence of Nen and Nen beasts has been revealed everyone is eager to obtain as much information about it from Kurapika in order to get the upper hand against their opponents. It is not only the princes who have their lives on the line, those who've sworn to protect are also at risk of being killed (and we've seen what happened to the majority of Prince Woble and Queen Oito's bodyguards). The Dark Continent arc is getting even more serious especially now that (view spoiler). If Togashi keeps up the good writing, this arc might surpass the Phantom Troupe arc as my favourite. Time will tell.
