Anyway I found that this this particular book was definitely a good book for those who may be interested in cats, especially if they are of any magick persuasion. It was well-organized, didn't jump all over the place, was easy to understand due to a nice conversational tone and didn't repeat itself to build up the number of pages. much more. There are also pages that provide information on feline power animals, gems and plants, cat care for specific situations such as introducing a baby to the family, cat astrology and cat colors.

What I enjoyed the most was the fact that each chapter started off with a sketch drawing of a cat doing various kitty activities as it capture the soul of these precious animals. And the selection of various quotes throughout pertaining again to the claim that cats have made on people who want to capture their essence.
