For me, this book has nothing to do with what's written on its back. The whole essence is concentrated on the second half of the last chapter. It felt much more real than the descriptions of the Elysium island and its population. David Bassano takes an interesting view of immortality, very rare in current days when immortal vampires and werewolves sell books like wild, and I'm sorry he hasn't wrote more about it. It's more of a sketches of that hypothetical future, and they are all shiny and perfect. Of course, there are wars concerning the poor part of the world but they are briefly mentioned. The entire focus of the book is on the immortality and how would those people spend their days, even if we get to know only one GM IM - Sophia.
