Ben Grayston is captivated by Clementine from the 1st moment when she slips on the ice & into his arms. A former sled dog musher, Ben is now a photographer covering the Gold Rush Trail sled dog race. But Clementine's zest for life & love for the Lord start to warm a place in his heart...a place that has been numb for a long time with grieving the loss of his dogs, & loss of his faith.
