Once Luna dumps Ruby she thinks everything will be perfect and that Angie will accept her with open arms. Unfortunately their tumultuous relationship begins and Luna has to fight her way into Angie's heart and family. Will love conquer all or is the reformed bad girl left out to dry?

This was my first read by the author and I loved the story. It was a perfect blend of angst and beginning relationship butterflies. The dynamic between Luna and Angie was amazing and from first sight the reader is hoping they will have a happily ever after.
