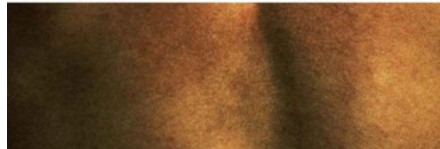

When a book starts off with a bang, literally, guns were actually being fired – you have my attention. I read the first chapter of Just Good Friends on fictionpress a few months ago and was really intrigued to know the rest of the story -the anticipation was killing me.

‘She glanced up at both of them to drive home her point. “I’m not ashamed of the life I live. I make an honest living, I pay my taxes, and I vote. If anyone doesn’t like it, they know where the door it.”’

We meet Audrey Hoffinger, a strong, self-assured woman. She has not had it easy by any stretch; she’s got her master’s degree but spends her days working two full time non-stop manual labor jobs (waitress and shelf stocker) with one day off a week...Tuesdays. After months and months of this, she needs something new...and she gets the idea to place an online ad for a ‘friends with benefits’ type relationship. She doesn’t have time for a relationship, but everyone needs human companionship, right?

‘Audrey turned back towards Mike. “Because that’s not who I am. At the end of the day, I need to be able to look at myself in the mirror and be alright with the person who stares back. Everyone deserves respect, until they’ve shown me otherwise.”’

Long story short, she meets Michael Kowalski, a former marine and cop and he proceeds to stick his foot in his mouth, forever ruining any chances with Audrey except for friendship. He was kind of a douche. So the plan is set, they are going to be friends – and that works, kind of. Mike goes above and beyond to make up for his actions and he is a terrific friend, which is part of what makes it so hard for Audrey.

“I’m sorrier than you’ll ever know. I’d like us to be friends. I think you’ll be good for me.” She raised her brow questioning his statement. “I think you’ll keep me honest. No one has forced me to think about my actions before quite like you, and I’ve never had a female friend.”

They work into the comfortable routine, he comes in with his other officers and Srgt, they eat, talk, build a bond, a friendship. All the time you’re screaming at Audrey on your kindle, *‘Good gravy girl, wake up and smell the sexy incredible man who is alllllll about you!’* Audrey is logical...practical....intellectual, but insanely frustrating in that aspect. She does finally give in and with one kiss she is lost for good.

“He gets under my skin like no one else. I don’t really understand it, and I don’t like it,” she admitted, feeling uncomfortable just thinking about the way he made her feel whenever he looked at her, never mind when he opened his mouth.

“The call that love,” Calvin said, putting his hand on her shoulder sympathetically.’

I mentioned the logical, practical, intellectual stuff? Yeah...well just cause she likes kissing Mike, doesn't mean that everything is going to be peachy keen. She sets up rules for their....whatever....and she is sticking to them. So by all accounts, this was a good book...and it was, I don't want that to be confused, but I had to be honest with myself. At least she has her boyfriend... well, maybe not. She discovers her best friend is sleeping with boyfriend, and that leaves her on her own. She decides, after several months of a sexual dry spell, that she wants a physical relationship without the emotional relationship to deal with. She places an honest add online to find someone to fit her needs. She get a response back from a man, only to find out that it's not him that is interested. John is looking for a love interest for his friend. Audrey will discover that physical is hard to separate from emotional as she falls for a man and builds friendships with others.

Mike Kowalski is an ex military man turned cop. He's got some issues from his past that making it hard for him to move forward, that is until he meets Audrey Hoffinger. First impressions usually say it all. Well, Mike messes that up big time, and Audrey isn't going to let him in that easily after their first awkward date. He begins to thaw from his icy cop persona. He starts to win Audrey over with his charm, but she refuses to make anything official. After events and pasts that present themselves Mike is getting Audrey moving in the right direction in their odd but functional relationship. In the end they both get what they needed whether they knew they wanted it or not.

This book gets 4 out of 5 stars from me!

After successfully completing her education she is ready to take on the world, but the world turns its back on her and she's left out in the cold. After leaving her cheating fiancé and the best friend he cheated with behind, Audrey finds herself alone, working two dead end jobs, and feeling defeated. She places an ad on an internet dating site hoping to find a casual relationship, but one reply email changes her life forever.

Audrey has issues. She doesn't trust anyone, she's working way too hard, and she's tired of being alone. I admire her independence. Most people would have crawled back home after the years of struggle, but Audrey is resilient. She is determined to make something of herself, even if that means working two jobs and sending out forty resumes a day. She has a fighting spirit that won't allow her quit or back down from adversity. When she meets the group of cops who become her surrogate family a lighter side of her comes out and brings with it a little vulnerability. She literally sparks with Michael and the electricity flies off the pages.

Michael has issues of his own. He has been beat down by love and refuses to let go of the past. That same determination comes in handy when he decides he wants Audrey in his life. He is very alpha male in a subtle way. He's formidable yet gentle, demanding without being domineering, and sexy in a charming way. He wasn't perfect and I liked that about him.

Audrey's newfound “family” are each unique and offer her pieces to the puzzle that make her whole. John is the brother she never had, Sarge is the father she longed for, and Garver is the goofy friend that everyone needs to have around. Together they round out a great cast of characters that will keep you invested in the story.

I just wrapped up Clean Slate and I'm honestly at a loss for words right now. I know that probably sounds awful so bear with me and I will explain. I really loved the beginning of the book. The character development of Audrey and Mike were very well done.

Audrey comes from a very well to do background. But her father was a bastard who cheated on her mother for decades with their housekeeper and her mother just took it because she liked the money and status that being with him brought her. Audrey decided at a young age that she would not be like her mother and end up in a loveless marriage while her husband cheats on her left and right. So, she packs up and heads out to live the hard earned life that most of us mere mortals have to live. Digging into the daily grind of two jobs, 16 hour shifts and 1 day off a week, Audrey lives her life with her English bulldog, Baron. For some reason one day she decides randomly to take type up a Personal Ad after finishing a round job applications. She's looking for a no strings, friends with benefits kind of thing. She gets two possibly responses. One from a friend of a guy and the other from a poetry and book nerd.

So we meet Mike, he's a former Marine with all the uptight ticks and quirks that go with it. He's now a New Jersey Police Officer along with his best friend John who answered the Ad for him. He's come out of a bad relationship with a girl who had an eating disorder and comes from a home where his mom left at a young age and his father has a disease caused by too many years of alcohol abuse and has landed himself in a nursing home.
