Awakening does not read like a debut novel. The writing is rich in history and culture and the plot is enthralling. As I mentioned before, I'm a purist when it comes to vampire mythology and having the story take place in Romania made the story that much more appealing to me. I love how well researched this book was. Adding elements of historical fact and culture adds a much desired sense of realism to the story and for me that is important. It may be fantasy, but it still has to make a certain degree of sense to hold my interest.

Nadia tries to hide a lot of what is going from her friends but she does try to get her mother to explain to her what is happening to her but her mom is reluctant to tell her anything. Nadia starts to have vision/nightmares that are very frightening and ones that she doesn't understand.

I will admit that I was originally lured in by the pretty cover- I absolutely love image used, with the two girl's faces blending into each other. Once I saw the cover, I knew I had to read the book. I found the story to be interesting, but really nothing like I had originally expected. I was expecting more a modern paranormal teen book, but instead this was more of a historical fantasy mixed with a modern story. The plot dealt with vampires, magic, war, secret societies, soulmates, death, murder, lies, and rebirth- a little bit of everything swirled together to create a new unique story.

The chapters alternated viewpoints and timelines, switching from Nadia in the present to Antanasia in the past. I was definitely more invested in Nadia as a character since she was more relatable and realistic to me. I thought the back story was important to the overall story and full of vivid images and history, but I was not really very interested in the characters, I just read the chapters to get back to Nadia and the mess that her life turned into. I did find it really interesting how the two eventually ended up being connected and the turns the story took. I am not sure how I feel about Nic and his role in both the past and present, but I guess I will have to wait and see

While Nadia was 19, this was not really at all a teen book but very much so an adult story due to content and the characters. Awakening: Bloodline is a story of two parts - one is told by Nadia, who has just celebrated her 19th birthday in the present day. The other is told by Ananstasia in the past. They are one and the same, but it all becomes clear as the story progresses. Nadia has her friends and mother, but her life is changing and she doesn't know who she can speak to. New characters appear in her life, and she doesn't know what to do with them either.

This is a fast-paced story, full of promise. I would say that although this is very well written, this book is more of laying down the groundwork for future books. It shows the relationships that Nadia/Ananstasia have, their enemies, their friends. Nadia suddenly has these abilities, but has no idea what to do with them. She also doesn't know who is "good" and "bad". It does end on a cliffhanger, but the surprise given wasn't really a surprise, as the details given in the book sort of gave it away.

This was a fun, entertaining read--and that cover is GORGEOUS! I love how the cover reflects the dual perspectives/time jumps we have happening within these pages--even the color differences, while maintaining the same tone, lend a sense of personality to the book. Covers like this one are the reason I breathe, penguins--there's so much detail to digest and ponder over!

I was just a tiny bit disappointed in the world-building of this book. I feel like a LOT of things happen in quite a short period of time, and that left me feeling a little dizzy in the end. There were a lot of questions I found myself asking that were never really answered for me. I feel like we spent so much time focused on

our main duo and their personal feelings, and not enough learning about the worlds surrounding them both. I felt, at times, that the author mentioned certain aspects of the world...but never really gave them time to develop or be explored. For instance...why is it only AFTER the ceremony that Antanasia can feed upon animals? What about the world or their biology makes this happen? The ending of this read was also a bit vague and confusing--I found myself unsure of what had just happened, and confused about what to think.

Rats' affinity for blood made me wonder if they were real Vampyres in tiny, furry bodies.

The characters, for the most part, were believable and intriguing...though Nadia had several unfortunate "immature" moments that made it hard for me, personally, to connect with her as a character. By this, I mean she had a tendency to overreact and overdramatize. In another character, this might have worked...but for Nadia, who seems overall pretty clear-headed and well-grounded, it was a bit of a shock. It also felt as if these moments might have been part of a ploy to keep the plot moving forward, though I might be wrong about that.

Still, this was an entertaining read with plenty of snark and sass to go around! I'm curious about the world and these characters, and will be waiting for book two to see if any of my answers/curiosities are cleared up. The characters are fairly believable, the read was quick and full of action, and I can't wait to see what the next installment promises for us readers! I'd recommend this to lovers of: all things vampire, dual-perspectives/time jumps, and snarky characters. Pull your hood down and take a sip, penguins; let the battle begin!
