The book started out with a "paranormal" feel to it with the "bonding" connection the three characters felt upon meeting, but that's where it ends.

Kendall Aaronson owns a shop specializing in home decor. Two young male college students walk in one night and there was an instant connection with the both of them. She didn't understand why they would be attracted to her since she's a 32 year old woman who happens to be on the "plumper" side. What can they possibly see in her?

Sutter Campbell is a 22 year old college student studying law and his best friend since third grade is Joshua Reed. They've been best friends for 14 years and share a "unique" friendship. Many thought they were gay and were a couple, but that was far from the truth...until they meet Kendall.

The two young men were attracted to her from the very beginning and they instantly knew she was the "one." Kendall had reservations being with two gorgeous, young men who were still both in college. As mentioned before, there was a paranormalesque feel in the beginning, especially the "connection" all felt when they were together (they can communicate feelings with one another), but that's as far as it went. Once Kendall got over "it" and accepted the two males as her "mates" the bulk of the book was all sex - and PLENTY of it! I found the characters flat and were not quite developed. You get a brief history about them, but their personality didn't seem appealing. Unbelievable instant feelings of "love" or romance, but rather more lust and NO true emotions (no matter how much they profess their feelings to one another). The author brought the story in too many directions with this book in terms of "theme" and didn't quite establish a solid story. It was like watching a porn movie rather than reading erotica.
