I would have enjoyed this book a lot more except I really hated the heroine, and found the ending to be ridiculous.

Lori and Grayson broke up a year ago after Lori walks out on him because he asked her to move in with him (she wanted a marriage proposal). She leaves him without saying goodbye or even leaving a note, but gets mad that he was hurt. She gets mad when Gray doesn't want to risk having unprotected sex with her. She complains that he doesn't take anything seriously and just wants to have fun, then she complains that he is too dedicated to his career with the military. She dreams of him quitting his job, even after he has told her the military is his life. She sits around wondering if she can put up with his hang ups, but fails to see all her own ridiculous hang ups. Honestly, Lori drove me nuts.
