This is the (for me) much anticipated sequel to Sleepy Hollow, which I read last year. The first book is a retelling of the famous Headless Horseman legend from the point of view of Katrina VanTassell. It is beautiful, romantic, scary and action-packed. The second book is not a let down after all of that, but it is pretty different from the first book as it ventures far from the famous tale. It begins a couple months after the first one ends, finding Katrina and Ichabod living in a new town under false identities. She is still being haunted by the ghost, and it seems to be calling her to come with him - but for what reason? The first half the story isn't terribly chilling, but the new characters that Katrina meets are engaging and the plot moves along quickly. Mid-way through the book the terror begins for real, and it is pretty spine-tingling through to the end. In this story, Katrina is 18, and Ichabod even older, and there are a couple love scenes. So I would actually rank this as a book geared more toward older teens and adults. Definitely a fun, spooky read.

Katrina spends her time in servitude, in a bake shop while Ichabod apprentices to a firm, hopeful that they have left the horrors of Sleepy Hollow behind them. But the killings and haunting of Sleepy Hollow has followed them as the Horseman calls out to Katrina to return. There are flyers passed out with her likeness, a reward for her capture as she stands accused of witchcraft. Katrina knows that they cannot wait any longer and plans to return to Sleepy Hollow to find the treasure she left hidden. But the Horseman also waits in Sleepy Hollow for her. With secrets of his own.

Return to Sleepy Hollow is a sequel but stands well on its own. Not so much a tale of romance as it is a young adult adventure tale. Told through the eyes and thoughts of Katrina, it gives the tale a much different feel than through the eyes of Ichabod who plays a minor part in this story. It is about Katrina and the Horseman the past they share.

Well written and paced, it is a good tale, but I would have enjoyed it much more had more time been spent in Sleepy Hollow than in Philadelphia with characters who in the end, had little to do with the bigger picture of the novel.
