This was a disappointing 2.5 star read. There was no world building or real feeling of being tied to the historical era and the hero's actions and reactions just seemed contrived and unrealistic. He tells the heroine repeatedly that she is no more than a mistress for one year and he will marry someone else after that (which given the circumstances in which they are placed together makes some sense initially), but it is his careless repetition of that same statement after they formed a bond that seemed to be contrived to me and only used as a plot point to drive conflict.

Convinced that she's unattractive to men, Lady Edith can not believe her feelings for Brand are returned. When one of the rebels who survived presents a threat to their growing relationship, will Edith risk her people or heart?
