Generational Sins deals with an experienced submissive who is unable to process emotional pain without physical pain (sometimes extreme)

So this is not for the average BDSM reader. It deals with a very different type of dominance, family violence, sexual abuse, and a wealth of other emotions. It is also a story of hope and love.

David is studying to be a doctor, like his father. David's father is regarded as the pillar of the community but in reality he is an abusive sadistic father and husband. Control is the only thing he loves and respects.

When David leaves for college he takes his father's lessons with him - how to use and abuse women. David must provide a weekly report on how many woman he has f....d in a week and what the experience he has gained from this.

At college David meets Katlyn - a classmate who is his intellectual equal but becomes his emotional saviour.

I read this story in one go. I was captivated from the opening paragraph (which was shocking and gives you a taste of what is to come) until the end. It was well written and provided me with another view of BDSM. I also liked the way Samantha Blair told the story in timelines each chapter told from Kat and David's perspective.

Generational Sins is not your traditional BDSM story. It may content various truly hot scenes but main feature of this story was definitely original and interesting plot. The idea of having experienced sub (Kat) who introduces natural but inexperienced Dom (David) to the world of BDSM and safewords was very interesting for me. Also, I really liked the reasons behind Kat's willingness to be a submissive. She was independent and intelligent woman, always taking care of herself so she needed someone (the Dom) to take some burden of decision making from her shoulders. **"She wanted someone to take the responsibility and decision making for a while. She spent most of her life being a responsible, self-disciplined adult, and she wanted some time where she didn't have to be in charge."**

I really admired Kat's psychological strength in this story. In order to save her beloved man and his mother from abuse, she was willing to get through the plenty of humiliation and trauma. David truly had my respect. He chose the harder path in his life, wanted to make a difference and be a good person. Some parts of this story were hard to believe for me, especially some reactions of main characters to the terrible situations they found themselves in. I am going to use a word that may confuse you in regards to this book. I seriously think this may be the most romantic book I have read. Now I do not mean that in the traditional sense; let me explain. To me romance is not just the hot guy who comes in and sweeps your off your feet. It's not the lust that is felt in the beginning of a relationship. **True Romance, true love** to me is finding that one person that gets you. The person you do not have to hide anything from. That ONE person whom is your lover; best friend, your confidant, teacher, support, your greatest strength and also your biggest weakness. David has had an unusual upbringing. His father being a controlling and abusive man has taught David how women should be treated. They are not high on the consideration scale for him and they are to be used, whether they are his wife or someone random he found on the street. David is so brainwashed and afraid of disappointing his father that he succumbs to his will and desires. That is until the day David sits down in his biology lab and a beautiful brunette sits down next to him as his partner. From the moment David meets Kat, he knows the nagging questions about his behavior and what is right or wrong will be tested.

***"She was offering me a relationship with her – a real relationship. She wouldn't judge me, and she wouldn't let me hurt her. She was giving me an outlet. It was everything I had ever wanted, and it scared the fuck out of me."***

I absolutely love how Ms. Blair handled the sexual relationship between David and Kat. David is so conflicted about what he likes in the bedroom and to have someone as strong as Kat tell him from the beginning that his tastes are not wrong and that she would help him see that was beautiful. It is rare that we get a strong female in a book that can take the lead the way Kat does. To have her so strong in their relationship to be David's equal was beautiful. I really think Kat played against what many see as the stereotypical Submissive woman; she may like to submit to her partner sexually but that does not mean she is not a smart, strong, confident independent woman at the same time.

***"I saw her as my equal, my everything, and no matter which room we were in. I loved her with all my being, but we both behaved differently depending on the setting. We drew hard lines between playtime and real life. Those lines kept us safe."***

Now, because I have said I considered this to be romantic does not mean I think this is a light read. While this has the story of David and Kat there is the serious subject of abuse. David's father is horrible, completely sadistic and someone who is never to be sympathized with...EVER! What he does to his family and others is unforgivable to me.

***"You're fucking weak, you sissy. No son of mine will cry into his mother's apron. Fucking take it like a man."***

Having to face evil head on is never pretty and the aftermath is always ugly. Having said that, I am again in awe of how the author deals with it. There is no fade to black scene with a HEA. There is no glossing over the true emotions that come from dealing with something that can damage the soul, the psyche and destroy a relationship.

The author gives an insightful view into the real day-to-day life of a couple in a D/s relationship. It's not what some have read in other books. I gained much more knowledge and understanding of why a person would willingly go into a submissive relationship and actually gain pleasure from it. While Kat loved David dearly and truly her willingness to submit was not just for his pleasure but for her own. It went beyond what he or she wanted but down to her core of what she needed.

*"I opened myself up to him and let him give me the release that I needed. Everything that I had been stressing about faded into the background, and I focused solely on the physical feelings that he was giving me."*

Generational Sins has quickly earned a spot on my list of best reads. I understand it is not for everyone and I recommend people that are looking to read it examine the warning that is attached to it and be self aware. Regardless of the auto generated "If you like blah blah blah, you will like this," use your best judgement before you dive in and use this as your next read after a certain trilogy.

David has the appearance of a man in control. He is gorgeous, goal oriented and wreaks sophistication. Underneath all the facade he is anything but in control. Growing up in a home where his father is an abusive husband to his mother, David begins to learn through example of his father that women are simply cattle. A simple number to add to his roster every weekend, until he meets Katlyn.

David realizes the minute he meets Kat that she is more than just a piece of meat to have his way with and immediately becomes fascinated with her. Kat becomes the object of his desire but because he fears she would not be able to handle his rough sexual behavior that borders abuse, he becomes her friend. Every woman he takes to his bed needs to resemble Kat in some way in order for him to get satisfaction. While roaming for his next tally mark he mistakes Kat for a possibility and immediately runs to the next available woman. That night is the pivotal moment that David learns not only is Kat his object of his desire but also his light in his darkness.

Kat was such an amazing character to me because even though she felt David did not want her she still knew what he needed. This story was different from other D/s books that I have read. In Generational Sins, Samantha Blair tells the happy and tumultuous side of loving David - a young man who is broken by the sins of his father.

I am not going to focus on the abuse in this book for this review because this book was less about abuse to me than strength. Yes – STRENGTH. Strength to overcome the abuse. Strength to love. Strength to forgive. Strength to forget. And strength to live.

In all the books I have read, Kat is the first submissive to actually be the strongest person in the book. David was dominant in an abusive way – taught by his father. This book started off with a bang, letting me know right away that this author wasn't going to pull any punches. All through the first few lines, pages and chapters, I had the feeling that this would be a great book. I tried to hold back my expectations, but it just didn't work. Thank goodness this book turned out to be amazing.

I normally dislike books that include multiple timelines, alternating between the past and present. But this book made me realize why - usually one of the timelines wasn't nearly as compelling as the other, making me bored and eager to return to the good one. They were both students when they met and they enter into a relationship that ends up a Dom/sub relationship as well. They end up hiding their romance and eventually their marriage from David's parents as his dad is extremely abusive and David doesn't want him near Kat. Of course, down the road they do get found out and his father becomes a major trial that they both always have to be ten steps ahead of to try and keep things smoothly running. There is so much that goes on in this book that it must be read to truly enjoy the up and down ride that you get from reading it.

The only thing that some may find distracting is how each chapter ends up from two different time periods, so you are getting a story of the past and then the present with each chapter. I fell into the pattern really quick so it didn't bother me; but some may not like that. I found it kept me anticipating what was going to happen next at all times! I also fell in love with David when he gets help from Kat's old Dom, in order to make sure he treats her right in their Dom/sub dynamic. It was extremely humbling for him to do; but he did it for Kat's best interest and from then on he had my respect immediately. I would have liked to know more about Kat's life history as I got the feeling that there might have been a story there but the focus was on David's dysfunctional family, not hers. I am hoping that maybe the author will think to do another book based on Kat's history.

Generational Sins went far outside my normal comfort zone so I was surprised that I enjoyed it as much as I did.

David has been a victim of his father's controlled abuse his entire life. It isn't until he meets and falls head over heals for Kat, that he realizes how sick and evil his father truly is. Kat is an intelligent, beautiful girl who just happens to have a submissive side that she aches to have David dominate. David and Kat love one another unconditionally and try to work towards a life when they can finally save David's mother from his tyrant of a father and pull themselves out from under his control.

BDSM is not my normally preferred genre. I have read a few I've loved and a few that made my skin crawl so much I couldn't get past the first few chapters. Generational Sins was a bit of both. There were a few scenes within the book involving David's father that made my stomach roll with nausea. But then David would profess his love to Kat, and it was so obvious he loved her so much that the mix of sweet and sour just worked.

Being written in first person with both David and Kat's perspective of both present and past was wonderful. I could see where some reviewers stated that it was a bit confusing but I loved it. It did take a sentence or two reading into the chapter for it to click who was up to bat, and to what time frame they were referring, but once it was clear it flowed almost perfectly. This style leaves no questions as to how the H and h feel about each other, how they feel about what is going on around them, or how their relationship came to be in the state that it is. I would love to read more books with this style of narration. I love character driven books, they're my absolute favorite.

I was lucky enough to pick this Kindle book up for free (I think now it's .99). This was by far the best freebie I've ever read. The only reason I knocked it down from 5 to 4 stars was because of the few parts which portrayed David's father that I just didn't feel comfortable with. That was very simply personal preference and had nothing to do with the quality of writing that Ms. Blair demonstrated.

This book was okay. I never really bought David as a Dom. He came across almost totally beta to me. This wasn't really a romance as it wasn't about these two people falling in love but rather about David dealing with his brutally abusive father, his abused mother and his own messed up upbringing. He needed to learn to be a Dom because he was in a relationship with an experienced Sub. I had the feeling however that if he had fallen in a love with a vanilla sex loving woman he would have changed to be what she needed. I'm not sure why either. At first, I thought the heroine (Kat) was a very damaged woman. I was wrong. I didn't understand at all why she wanted love the way she did. The more I read the more I understood her and what she wanted....and I was ok with it. I personally am not one for bdsm, but it is interesting to read. I think this book made it ok for me...in a way. The spankings and submission is truly what Kat needed.

I have always said that I will never ever stand by and be verbally and physically abused, that's goes for sexually abused as well. I grew up around people abusing each other often. I'm not sure why woman do it, I can only imagine why, but I know for sure that I would not and could not let that ever happen to me. It's one thing to like sex rough, there are times when we all want it (let's be honest), but its another to be called 'slut' while you're having it or to be slapped so hard you have bruises on you. And that's what happened in this book. I was totally taken back by it since I've never read it before. Yet, I couldn't stop reading it.

I should start off by saying that this story has two main focuses...in a way, and two different time lines, which most people might have a problem with. I didn't. I actually enjoyed reading the different time lines, because, well, it was done just right. Each chapter was either past or present time. I wasn't lost or confused and I looked forward to each chapter. There are also two point of views as well. Again, not hard to follow and you get the hang of it early on. We have the main couple, David and Kat and the secondary couple, David's parents, Richard and Ellen. Although the story is meant to focus on David and Kat, the parents are such a strong focus as well.

David's father, Richard, sees woman as a lesser equal. He believes woman are suppose to submit and obey to men. David doesn't agree. But he wants to make his father proud so he starts to follow what his father says and make up lies to please him along the way....that is until Kat shows up. I lost so much faith in David....even though Kat was on board with it all.

David and Kat are both in college when they meet, starting off as lab partners. Their relationship is purely platonic yet both having feelings for each other. David feels an instant attraction to her and fights it as long as he can, that is until they meet by chance at the same club. Surprisingly to both, they enjoy the same flavor of love making. But David doesn't know what it means to be a Dom. So Kat takes the initiative and tops from the bottom, guiding David into the role of the dominate.

This book was so out of my comfort level but I think it's what I needed too. We see what it's like to be abused and loved at the same time. This book has a lot of sex in it but it needs to have it in order to understand the story. It was graphic but not dirty graphic...again, it's needed. There were some reviews I read where people were actually stunned with how David's mother, Ellen, acted after Richard's death. How can you be surprised by it! It was abused on so many levels (for 30 years!) it was scary! She probably saw it as a relief that he was no longer there to torture her and her son David.

I truly felt that David and Kat loved each other more than words can express....even though at time I wanted to strangle David for what he allowed.

Overall, I really enjoyed this book. A lot. I was a little upset with the ending though and how rushed it felt. We have this long drawn out mentally draining story, a great story, but the end was wrapped up so quickly that I can't help but be little upset about that. Kat's ex-Dom is called in to help with some issues and I expected more out of that. I was beyond excited when he was called in too.
