You're going to spend the first half of this book desperately wanting to tell Drew (the main character) that he's not crazy, and the second half trying to read fast enough to keep up with the cascade of action.

I'm not even sure how to classify this book. Superhero? Spiritual warfare? Political thriller? It's all three!

It's been years since a lab accident resulted in Drew Carter's visions of alien invaders--his term for the angels and demons he can now see. Now he's draw the attendtion of the American government. Always a patriot at heart, Drew is excited to serve in the CIA despite the underhanded way he's drafted into service. His problem is, he doesn't know who he can trust. When a psyciatric exam tells him his visions are conjured by his subconscious, he doesn't even trust himself. Drew is isolated from his family and the girl he loves, and he's coming undone.

In this third book in Chuck Black's "Wars of the Realm" series, Drew finds himself in custody related to a campus shooting where he was present. FBI agents believe he was part of the planning and the possibility of 40 years in prison is rather sobering. He certainly can't admit that he's seeing invisible invaders ever since a science lab experiment went very wrong. His friend Ben is still in hiding following the disaster and Drew is doing his best to thwart the evil only he seems to be able to see.

A mysterious "Mr. Ross" comes to Drew's rescue by offering him his freedom in exchange for cutting all ties with family and friends and working with the government on highly secretive operations. All the survival skills he learned from his stepfather make him one of the most qualified recruits and soon he's working on the most dangerous missions. But he's not always sure who he can trust and who is really calling the shots. And he still isn't sure who the invaders are that only he can see.

In between missions, Drew is keeping an eye on Sydney Carlyle. Could the key to understanding the invaders be connected to the faith that she so strongly adheres to? As invading forces conspire to thwart Drew at every turn, will he live long enough to find the answers? And can he keep safe the ones he loves and the country he serves?

The book won't make much sense if you have not read at least the first book in the series. Book 2 fleshes out more details but doesn't propel the story line all that much (mainly offering an alternate perspective of the events in Book 1). For those who like political thrillers with a spiritual element, *Light of the Last* will deliver an unforgettable experience.

In this third installment of the Wars of the Realm series, *Light of the Last* has the perfect amounts of suspense and believable characters to keep it's plot engaging and thrilling, causing many to call it the best book of the series.

The intense battles of the supernatural realm (angels and demons) keep the book from having a lot of physical bloodshed, however the graphic battles are still very intense because demons fight with much deadlier weapons and with much deadlier consequences. In addition to this suspense, the plot line also deals with large amounts of terrorism, diseases, and plots against America that are incredibly believable.

There is not any cussing (that I caught) and the romance was very mild, only containing a few kisses (not considerably detailed). The scenes featuring demons do tend to be very dark and may cause unwanted fear in younger readers, but this book is extremely eye-opening to the reality of the supernatural realm all around us, and for that it is very well done.

Overall, this book (along with the entirety of the series) is a wonderful read and I give it a full 5 out of 5

I closed it this morning, having read tons of pages over the last couple of days. Being sick gives me more time, but it was such a relief to even want to read a book. And the best thing about Light of the Last? As soon as I closed it, I wanted to jump up and write something awesome with all the inspiration this had given.

The technology in this book is really, really cool. I can't imagine how fun it was as an author to create Ben and Drew and the NexTech team. The jacket Witness, with its 360 camera and the earpiece with "Alice"--a technology voice able to fulfill any request--was tons of fun. Couple that with Drew's penchant for constantly getting himself in life-threatening situations, and you'll have one crazy ride. I really wished Witness and Alice were real gadgets, because I would have loved to use them and go on adventures.

I loved the theology. It brought twists and surprises to the book that I never saw coming. Several guesses I had were turned upside down. To be honest, I was surprised that this book was written so frankly--it's politically forthright and far from politically correct. I'm really, really glad Multnomah put it out, because I think it contains a good wake-up call about America, Muslims, and Israel in its pages. Chuck Black does a good job creating drama using fictional spin-offs of real-life events.

I'm really impressed with the picture Chuck Black gave us of the main character, Drew. "Agent Carter" is cool. We see him struggling, working, years passing as he builds up his skill sets. He's not a believer, and he's grown up with a regular American lifestyle. While he doesn't do anything hugely immoral, he's realistic--and so is the culture in which he lives. A lot of homeschool dads might not write this way, but I think



Chuck's willingness to explore different lifestyles in his fiction will enable him to reach a much wider audience of young people with the Gospel.

The sidekicks were well fleshed-out: Ben, Reed, Sydney, Ethan, Ross, and Jake. Drew's relationship with his step-dad, Jake, and friend, Ben, I especially loved. Also, the angel plots with Validus and his pals carried on much better than book two, partnering with Drew's perspective to move the story forward. Originally I thought book two was an unnecessary installment. Now I think it laid some really important groundwork, but I still think it's a danger spot for giving up the series. You can't quite read books one and three and get a complete picture, so I still suggest reading book two in order, but one and three are still my favorite.

There were a couple of sections where I got freaked out by the intensity--a couple of places where my belief was suspended, specifically the nanobots. But they were so small, really, it doesn't diminish five stars. Most times the intensity was pleasantly high, without being disturbing.

This book gave me giant amounts of fun, adventure, and inspiration. It's the story of a hero, and I love modern-day stories of heroes. It's a geeky story of twenty-somethings trying to save America, and since I'm a twenty-something and I love America, that resonated with me too. It's a story of people who value Israel, and I very much value Israel. It has commitment, jokes, sacrifice, and God's hand of providence all wrapped into one tight package.
