What can I say but....HOT'ish! It was a well-crafted, easy to read story. The premise is that Ellie Simpson, psychologist (and author of a book on the virtues of abstinence in a relationship), has saved herself for marriage to her fiancée Riley but is devastated when she finds out Riley has been with other woman physically since they became engaged. So to assist Ellie in getting over her heartbreak, her best friend Sidney takes her to Las Vegas for New Year's Eve. And the most out of character thing happens....Ellie ends up hooking up with a guy for a night of debauchery. Now I must say... this is where I found the plot a bit far-fetched. If a woman has waited her whole life, why would she then break this vow to herself to a veritable stranger? Can't really see it happening...but this is fiction after all.

Now the reader will quickly learn that Ellie feels she is average looking. What she is ...is a petite woman with a BAD haircut and a smokin' body. And men just ogle her "big rack". So hooking up in Vegas was not a problem. In comes Matthew....the smokin' hot guy of the story. Matthew has NEVER had a problem with his love 'em and leave 'em lifestyle but for some reason...after a HOT evening with Ellie, he does not want to move on with anyone else. Ring in the Holidays kicks off in Las Vegas, the anti-Christmas-spirit capital of the United States. Clinical psychologist Ellie Simpson had an unfortunate encounter with a dull razor, her dissertation isn't quite finished, and her fiancé broke off their engagement. Best friend Sidney has the perfect solution. According to her BFF/assistant, there can't be a better environment which in to move on than smoky, sexually charged, and salacious Vegas. Her response to Ellie's complaints about the Vegas atmosphere is dead on: "At the rate you're going, you'll live to be a hundred. A hundred-year-old, unhappy, nonsmoking, tee-totaling virgin."

But waiting in the wings is Mr. Right aka attorney Matthew McPherson. He sweeps Ellie off her feet and on

to the crowded dance floor.

Suddenly, sexual attraction became something more than just a definition in a textbook. Like iron filings to a magnet, every cell in her body shifted toward the man. Her heart thumped like crazy, her breath paused, and the pit of her stomach felt as if she had just reached the peak of the highest roller coaster.

Matthew and Ellie decide to sashay their way out of the cocktail lounge into his suite which is “decorated entirely in various shades of red” and is known as The Heat Suite. Ellie is sophisticated and witty, quipping that the burgundy red room is “very feng shui” and eventually getting into a heated discussion with a complacent, satiated Matthew about the probabilities of having female orgasms solely through penetration. Ellie makes up for lost sexual time, shimmying down the shiny brass stripper pole, racking up some impressive orgasms through outer and inner penetration, before finally slipping away in the wee hours.
