Nora sitzt harmlos im Bio-Unterricht, da kommt ihr Lehrer auf die Idee sie mit Patch ein Projekt erarbeiten zu lassen. Das gefällt ihr gar nicht. I chose to read the Hush Hush Saga because of the good reviews it received and well I wanted to try something new. While the story is intriguing in some parts and totally infuriating in others. The story leaves you wanting some depth. It is just too much of a mess and not enough satisfaction for it.

The other thing that bothered me beyond reason was the "Love" Patch and Nora supposedly felt for each other. It was overdone and not smooth in its transition. As I finished the first book it seemed odd to me that there was 3 more books since the first book finished off like a standalone.
