That's what we have here. In my opinion, "Tooth Fairy" has pretty poor illustrations, a pretty poor story, and the tooth fairy's palace is just about the most disgusting place I could ever imagine. I think if students believe that their teeth can also end up in the special hall that they will take better care of them. Also, they realize that lying is bad, which is also a good lesson for my students to learn.
