The author calls this a reverse harem series, but this series isn't for readers who are picky about what they consider to be a reverse harem. The characters are in a four-way relationship, even if they mostly focus on the MC, so this is more of a menage a quatre than a reverse harem. I enjoy some mm in my harems, but it isn't really a harem anymore if ALL of the harem members are involved with each other.

Speaking of relationship dynamics, I was kind of unclear on what was expected of coven members because Gwen's coven didn't seem to be particularly romantically involved (mainly because I can't picture Bryce in that scenario) but the MC seemed to automatically understand that her men would be romantically involved with whomever they chose as their fourth. A big part of this uncertainty arose because so much of the focus was on whether the MC would agree to officially join the coven, but readers didn't learn how that would happen until 98% into the book. As such, I didn't know exactly what I was hoping would happen.

As for the characters, the MC was a bit of Mary Sue, and I was annoyed that she was constantly going on about how the men were too good for her—though, to be fair, she was utterly uninteresting until she learned to use her magic, so maybe she was right. I liked all the men well enough, but I think Callum will be the most interesting going forward. I love the contrast of the awkward uber-intellectual who used to be what

essentially amounts to a child soldier. It looks like that aspect of his character is going to be important in the next book, and if I finish book 2 (I put it on hold at 14% to read something else), that will likely be the reason why. Also, I thought the MC's relationship with Gwen's coven should have been handled better. At the time, I liked that we didn't see the MC's dinner with Gwen's coven because I didn't care about them, but not having those scenes made their post-dinner friendships seem sudden and underdeveloped, simply because we hadn't seen the process of those relationships forming.

The horror elements—some awful, mysterious, and powerful creature picking people off and causing massive damage off screen—were my favorite parts of this book, as you don't typically see this many horror elements in fantasy books

As a side note, the narrators for chapters 20 and 23 were labeled incorrectly in the Kindle edition, which made their first sentences fairly confusing.

Wow, where to start! I read this in a day because I couldn't put it down. The characters were well thought out and relatable. Really this book had everything I enjoy, a bit of fantasy, romance, mystery and suspense.

The story centers on a shy unassuming, somewhat stereotypical country librarian (in training). It follows her introduction the big university town where she meets an interesting cast of characters and romantic interests. Just as she is developing a place for herself among the people and in her job, a strange and deadly foe begins to wreak havoc on the town. Woven though out this book is a world where magic is simply a part of life, a small part for some of them and a large part for others. Covens are a normal part of magical life, with the typical being 4 partners. Joanne doesn't see magic as really being a part of her life, seeing as she never showed any magical skills. As such she had become a book-lover and felt most at home among the shelves of a library. But little does she know that her life is about to change drastically.

What I think I liked most about this book was the way that the author introduced the world and the society without ever feeling like it was being explained to you. This story doesn't clearly state what time frame its happening it seemed to have modern things within it but some of the references make it seem like its older times, then it jumps back to modernish. We meet Joanna a 27 y/o librarian/witch who has just accepted a job at the Canderfey University. Joanna is your typical nerdy librarian that loves books and has a hard time with real people. Her self-confidence is also low as she thinks she has no magical powers and is not really a witch in her opinion.

We then meet the men that will make up her coven at different points in the story. Callum, Aiden and Isaac. One is the soldier, one is the scholar and one is the artist, together they make a trio in search of a forth to complete them.

The storyline itself is intriguing and the differing personalities and perspectives is great. What brought the story down was the author tried in my opinion to be too mysterious and only letting bits and pieces of the characters and the circumstances come out. Some of the transitions were a bit confusing as you tried to follow along.

I had not realized that covens were sexual in nature. Are all of the covens there reverse harems or just this one? The author does a lot of alluding to things but doesn't really clarify a lot. What type of magic do the men have? It seemed there was an allusion to one of the other men from a different coven being a shifter but it's not really said. If this was a movie I would say there are a lot of dramatic intense looks with hidden meanings but nothing concrete is given.

It was nice to see some insecurities in at least one of the males, it's usually the female character that has tons of insecurities and the men are all gods with no worries. The heat level was mild they do have sex and there is some male on male action so if that bothers you be aware.

I guess I was hoping with her new found skills that Joanna wouldn't dissolve into the typical running away female when her insecurities get the best of her...alas I was wrong. She only stayed after validation by the good-looking men that she is worthy.
