Goalie Interference is author Nikki Worrell's second book. This second book continues with the story of Vlad Bejsiuk and Zoe Millis. We were introduced to them as the best friends of the main characters in Worrell's first book *The Enforcer*. These books are co-dependent, but I think these books can be read as stand-alones as well if you prefer this.

Sparks fly between Zoe and Vlad. Vlad has feelings for Zoe and Zoe has feelings for Vlad. But since Zoe is Vlad's hockey teams psychologist and they have a non-fraternizing policy, she is determined to shut down the warm feelings between them. Vlad, on the other hand, is determined to win over Zoe and is relentless in his pursuit of the feisty doctor. A devastating illness will leave Vlad's hockey career up in the air, but at the same time this gives the couple a perfect opportunity to be together. Or maybe there will be more unexpected twists in the way?

Here's my list of ♥ & ?'s for *Goalie Interference*:

♥ **Sporty:** I got to say, I'm weak for everything sports-related. I have a soft spot for sports romances and therefore this book was a must-read for me. Nikki Worrell is great at mixing sport and romance together, I think she solved this aspect of the book excellently. I could feel Vlad's pain when his career was hanging in a thin thread and I think Worrell portrayed the situation beautifully.

♥ **Surprising twist:** There's a little surprising twist in the end I didn't see coming and I love surprises.

? **Flat:** I really liked Worrell's first book and I had some expectations for this one, but I felt this book was missing something that I can't quite put into words. My biggest issue with the story is that it felt a little "flat" to me and I just couldn't connect with the characters, except from Vlad at times.
