In my opinion Lance and Ellie are really special characters. They've both had plenty of difficulties to deal with in their young lives, difficulties which have left them feeling isolated and unworthy of attention and interest from other people. As we watch them go on their individual and joint journeys through the book it's really lovely to see them discovering that they are worthy of love and acceptance, and to see them grow in confidence as people. It's also wonderful of course to see them falling in love with each other and finding something so precious together. Their story is extremely touching and readers are advised to keep tissues handy!

The rest of the characters in the book are well-drawn and are a great supporting cast. My favourite of these though has to be Lance's dog, Mahto. Never has the saying "Dogs are people too" been truer. The author has real skill in writing canine characters, and, as far as I'm concerned, Mahto is her best so far. Her love for horses also shines through, and it's fascinating for us as readers to be able to observe Lance as he works with them.

Mrs Henderson's research into all the areas of life that she covers in the book is, as ever, to a high standard and readers will feel that they are learning something new as well as enjoying a fantastic love story.

Eleanor has been mute since an attack when she was as a child and she saw her mother brutally killed. Her father never listens to Eleanor (she communicates with pencil and paper with most people) and treats her like she's a little slow on the uptake.

She comes to stay with her aunt (who also treats her like she's stupid) where Lance is working as a horse trainer. He has a goofy half wolf dog that was pretty good at playing matchmaker.

Lance is a drifter because he never feels he belongs anywhere and he is Ok with that, until meeting Eleanor. There's no instant this or that, but they are drawn together.
