What a fun book! I love a good alien romance and *Joran* by Susan Hayes delivers. A series called **Star-Crossed Alien Mail Order Brides** has got to be amazing, right?

The planet of Pyros is in trouble. Males outnumber females by a huge margin, leaving the future of the throne in peril. Prince Joran is the last of the royal line and must find his mate. Thankfully, the leaders of Pyros have found a planet inhabited by life compatible with their DNA: planet Earth.

When barista Maggie signs up for the Star-Crossed Dating Service, the last thing she expects is to end up with someone who's literally out of this world. Her hunky match, Joran, is charming and successful—and determined to make her his.

Joran immediately senses that Maggie is his mate, and he wants to bond with her right away. His enthusiasm gives Maggie pause initially—sure, this guy is gorgeous, but what's with the insta-love?! She even resists him at first because he comes on a little too strong for her. I don't read a lot of fated mates stories, so I'm still getting comfortable with the concept and Joran came on a little too strong for me as well.

When Joran reveals that he's from another planet, Maggie is not convinced—until he proves not only that he's an alien, but also that he and Maggie are fated to be together.

This is a really fun read. I especially appreciated that Maggie is no wilting flower—she's headstrong and forces Joran to see her perspective, something he's not used to doing on his planet due to his elevated status in life. I also liked Joran, who's head over heels devoted to Maggie from day one. He has his work cut out for him in convincing Maggie that they're meant to be, and she definitely makes him work hard to win her over.

I'm happy that this is the first in a series and look forward to reading the next book!

Okay, so this was so much fun. Maggie is a barista who has given up faith in things she can't see, hold, or depend on (which is basically a list that includes everything that's not her two best buds, and definitely includes most men). Her pals convince her to try a new online dating site, and there's enough wine in play that she goes with it, and then there's a drop-dead gorgeous man in her coffee shop and they're apparently a "match" and there's a literal spark between them.

Joran left a few things off his profile. First? He's not human. Second? He's not just an alien, he's an alien prince. Third? His species mate for life and that little spark was no random bit of static, it was a species deep genetic bond that just got switched to "go."

And boy was "go" sexy.

The Intergalactic Dating Agency has a new clandestine branch. Pyros is a planet in trouble, since the skewed male to female ratio is causing the population to diminish towards extinction. The Government of Pyros has gone rogue, acquired forbidden tech, and has set up the Star-Crossed Dating app to lure prospective human brides for their elite. First among the elite? Prince Joran, heir to the throne - but only if he mates. Meanwhile on Earth, barista Maggie, in a wine-induced moment of insanity, gets an invite to beta-test the Star-Crossed Dating app. Thirty and with no viable dating prospects, Maggie takes the bait. She's matched to Joran - and then it all goes up in flames (almost literally). Joran has some serious impulse control issues, while Maggie's long-entrenched self-protective streak leads her to lower expectations and distrust of anything as wonderful as Joran seems to be. Their mating goes like a house afire, the sex is incendiary, but the relationship nearly crashes and burns despite the bio-assist from The Scorching. The dramatic tension in their story is all emotional, as two likable but very different personalities struggle to catch up to biology, and two people who thought never to find true love discover that love may strike like a lightning bolt, but carefully tending the fire is the only way to keep it burning under control. Good writing, fast pacing, clever plotting and HEA - I'd call the new Star-Crossed Dating app a success.
