The Girl of Dracula is a finely assembled romantic suspense novel that features everyday life in modern Romania, the legends of Vlad the Impaler, and gypsy lore. Author Dorina Stanciu intertwines these elements for an enjoyable read and a journey to a satisfying ending.

Here's the basic story. Near the end of Adelina Marin's high school days, Alexander Vlad substitute teaches one of Adelina's classes. Adelina is immediately smitten with this scholar and expert on the life of Vlad the Impaler, the ruthless ruler who provided Bram Stoker's inspiration for *Dracula*.

Despite their age difference (Alex is almost twice as old as eighteen-year-old Adelina), a passionate love affair ensues. Adelina is mature and intelligent. While I found some of Alex's behavior oafish, this student-teacher affair troubled me a lot less than stories that feature naive young women and young anal-retentive billionaires who like to tie up and abuse said young women.

Alex witnesses a secret gypsy ritual at the Snagov Monastery, the reputed burial place of Vlad the Impaler. Alex has his own secret that Adelina accidentally discovers. Alex goes to a convention at the Hotel Dracula at Borgo Pass. All hell breaks loose. You'll need to read the novel to get the rest of the story. The novel, incidentally, is not a knock-off of *The Historian*

I like the way Author Stanciu teaches her readers about her native country, its traditions, and its places as a part of her narrative. The plot is expertly developed. The characters seem like real people. I like her references to real places.

The Girl of Dracula was originally written in Romanian and then translated to English. I do not believe that any fiction writer is invisible. You can almost hear a Romanian accent as you read this book. I love the author's voice. Some readers will find the novel's atypical prose constructions a distraction and some of the spelling of English words as they logically should be spelled a problem. This book in Romanian, I'm sure, deserves five stars. Its English version merits four.
