But, now their being thrown together again has given the reader hope for a wonderful conclusion.

Mountain Shadows Campground is Scott's new home and Robby brings him there and stays getting a job in the area.....Ms Harner lulled us into that quiet sense of 'we knew where this was going' and took a mallet to us and beat us over the head with it....
