This is the book that I picked to read sitting on the beach during my summer vacation and I was not disappointed. I enjoyed this fun, romantic read. I have had a chance to read two books by Chelsea Fine and have really liked both of them. I am becoming quite the Chelsea Fine fan.

Kayla is in town to attend her estranged father's funeral. It has been years since she has seen or spoke to her father. Daren Ackwood looked up to the same man and saw him as a father figure. The pair knew each other years ago so they both make a lot of quick assumptions without any merit.

Kayla's father has included the pair in his will but there is a catch and they soon find themselves handcuffed to each other. As they work to solve the scavenger hunt, both Daren and Kayla learn that they have misjudged each other. They both learn a lot of things about each other and about themselves.

I found this book to be extremely well written with a solid plot. I found the characters to be very likeable

although I have a hard time feeling sorry for Kayla because of her good looks. Kayla Turner is back in Copper Springs for her estranged dad's funeral. This is where she meets handsome, cocky and Porsche driving **Daren Ackwood**.

Kayla sees and remembers Daren as a spoiled brat who is nothing but good looks and no brains, and Daren sees Kayla as a heartless trustfund baby, who didn't care about her father's terminal disease until the actual will-reading. But looks can be deceiving.

Especially when at said will-reading, Kayla's father left them nothing but the option to handcuff themselves to each other in order to find a letter - whatever that letter may say...

I really loved Book #1 from the Finding Fate series (Best Kind of Broken), so I was really looking forward to reading Perfect Kind of Trouble. And as wary as I am with sequels to stories I really love, there was actually no need to be - because Perfect Kind of Trouble was indeed prefect and even better than Book #1.

The story starts off with a rather unusual plot that has Kayla and Daren embark into a rather hilarious scavenger hunt. Given that they don't regard each other highly was not going to be an easy tasks, but sure worth the chase in the end.

Oh Chelsea Fine, how I love you! This is yet another fun, romantic read with fabulous characters and a lot of heart. I was hooked from start to finish.

In the first book of this series, Best Kind of Broken, we met Daren and Kayla, and got a very interesting glimpse of the two of them together. Definitely enough to have me eagerly awaiting their full story, and I can happily say that I was not disappointed!

Returning to the small town of Copper Springs for the funeral of her absentee father, Kayla is bitter, angry, and in a desperate situation. She is alone, broke, and feeling fairly hopeless, but still dreaming of a better life for herself. Also at the funeral is Daren Ackwood. He too, finds himself at rock bottom and in hopeless circumstances, but is there to honour the man he thought of as a father. He takes one look at Kayla and writes her off as a bratty and spoiled princess. Kayla recognises Daren from childhood summers spent with her father, but thinks he is a rich, arrogant, manwhoring playboy. They couldn't be more wrong about each other (well, Daren couldn't be more wrong – Kayla is only slightly wrong), but their initial impressions of each other make for a fabulous starting point for a very interesting venture. Because, as much as they may despise each other on sight, they have both been left an inheritance from Kayla's wealthy father, but the catch is - they have to work together (REALLY, closely together) in order to claim it. And with both of them without any other options, they are forced to accept his cryptic conditions.

I'm not going to go into too much detail about the story or the journey that these two embark on because it's best to just sit back and enjoy it, but I thought this was a fantastic and fun set up to the story. Kind of ridiculous? Possibly. But somehow Chelsea Fine makes it work, and it's a great ride! The dynamic between Kayla and Daren is absolutely gold! Their antagonism towards each other is brilliant, with some sensational arguments and banter, all with an underlying current of mad sexual tension of course.

*“I don’t want you to think I’m some disgusting pig who just wants to drool all over you ...
Although, side note, I do want to drool all over you. I just don’t want to be piggish about it.”*

I glance him over again and frown. Goddamn Daren and his bandit kissing, getting my body all worked up and bringing on unsolicited belly twitches. I really need to get away from his fingers and hips, STAT.

She can’t say things like “give me a ride” and touch her mouth at the same time. That’s just not fair.

Then, when the chemistry becomes too hot for them to hide... DAYUM! There are some sensationally steamy scenes in this book, and it's all ties in brilliantly with the storyline, and the emotion the two characters are going through.

And with their enforced bonding, the two of them slowly start to open up to each other and they learn that all is not as it seems and things become quite emotional. My heart broke for both of them and the circumstances that they were in, and it made it even more special that they finally found somebody they could trust and depend on.

Watching him, I feel a piece of my heart break off and deliver itself into Daren’s hands, permanently. He somehow got a hold on me and now it’s too late for me to wriggle free, even if I wanted to. Which I don’t.

He leans in a bit so our faces are just an inch apart and sinks his eyes deep into mine. Then quietly he says, "I see you."

But with their pasts dragging them down, and their futures a huge big question mark, there is a lot that they have to work through - and I loved every minute of it! I didn't even mind the obligatory angsty bit because it adds to the intensity of it all, and I could understand exactly where both of them were coming from. And, of course, the resolution was gorgeous!

With chapters written in alternating POV, we get to know Kayla and Daren intimately, and as the events of the past are slowly revealed, I came to love them more and more. I also love the way that Kayla's father became a part of the story, even after his death. It's so beautifully done (and a little tear-inducing), and I thought the whole thing was really cleverly put together.

I loved this book! Told with Chelsea Fine's usual fun and humour, there were a lot of laughs, but also a beautifully told story of two very deserving people who manage to find something very special together.

Best Kind of Broken was my first book by Chelsea Fine and I really liked it! I've been looking forward to Daren's story and was so excited when I finally got a copy. The beginning of this book reminded me of Truly Madly Yours by Rachel Gibson, which isn't a bad thing because it's probably my favoritest book ever (I've read it about 7 times). Kayla has returned back home to her father's funeral. A father who hasn't spoken to Kayla in years and who Kayla wasn't even aware was sick. If it weren't for the fact that Kayla is broke, on her own and practically homeless, she might not have even come to his funeral. But when she finds out that he left her something in his will, she doesn't really have any other options so she decides to stay

until she gets her inheritance. Unfortunately, getting it means having to spend time with playboy Daren who was more of a son to Kayla's dad. Daren loved and looked up to Kayla's dad and can't understand how Kayla couldn't even come to visit her dad when he was dying. They both have their minds made up about each other and don't really like each other. Too bad they have to spend the next few days handcuffed to each other while they search for clues left to them about the inheritance. I loved the concept for this book!
