"Trimmed With Murder" is a cozy mystery. This is the tenth book in the series, but you don't need to read the previous novels to understand this one, and this story didn't spoil the previous mysteries.

The main characters are very nice, caring people, and they reacted realistically to the murder. The heroines asked reasonable questions and were good listeners. However, in this story, they were pretty slow to follow up on clues.

I had a fair idea of what was going on from the available clues. However, the heroines would see or be told clues that the author would hide from the reader. For example, they see someone they recognize in a position that is very revealing, but we're not told the person's name. Whodunit might come as a surprise because major clues were hidden from the reader. Hiding information that the viewpoint characters know is a major pet peeve of mine, otherwise I probably would have given this book a 4.5 stars.

There was no sex. There was a minor amount of bad language. Overall, I'd recommend this cozy mystery.

As always with Sally Goldenbaum's A Seaside Knitters Mystery series, Trimmed with Murder is full of friends, family and community unity. Also one of the interesting things about her books is each one centers on different main characters while the others still play a big part. This installment has Izzy's younger brother Charlie arriving after being incommunicado for years. Along his way to Sea Harbor a mysterious woman hitches a ride, she actually gets in without being asked. Unbeknownst to Charlie, Amber Hanson is coming home after being summoned to the reading of a will. It is the holiday season so lots of activities are going on in the wonderful town as well.

I love that the author lists the characters in the front. This is really helpful to me and especially helpful when there is such a large cast of characters. You do not have to be a knitter to enjoy the way these characters, Nell, Izzy, Cass, and Birdie knit together the clues of these mysteries. Along with the men in their lives, they are able to keep things from getting too tangled up. The murder in this one comes later in the book. I am not sure I enjoyed getting to know Amber, getting to care for her and then having her murdered. It seemed harder and harsher than normal. Charlie's relationship with Amber also made her murder that much sadder. It was the one thing I really did not care for. And for Cass and Danny to find the body while they were making strides in their relationship was also a bit rough.

Sally Goldenbaum has a wonderful and warm writing style and that did soften the blow at times in this one. Her characters are always enjoyable. The care with which she crafts them, the way they interact and get involved with their community is superb. Trimmed with Murder is an intuitive and insightful mystery. The side stories are intricate and stitched together perfectly with the murder mystery. Descriptive writing really paints a wonderful picture of the Christmas season in Sea Harbor. Izzy wants to keep her brother from being arrested for the holidays. The first annual tree trimming contest is endearing. Definitely a great cozy for the season.

All of the Seaside Knitters Mystery series can be read as stand-alone books, however reading them is like coming home to visit for the holidays. The characters have become friends and as their lives have bloomed and changed, long time readers are able to enjoy the growth. I really love the characters, with Nell and Birdie being my favorites. At First Glance: *Trimmed With Murder* looks like a great cozy mystery to bundle up with on a dreary day. Though my days this week have not been as dreary, summer made some kind of a comeback, *Trimmed With Murder* was still a great cozy to bundle up at nights with. It was exactly what I was looking for starting this November. I love books with holiday themes around this time of year and Sally Goldenbaum delivered just that.

As Sea Harbor prepares for Christmas by kicking off a Christmas tree contest, two new strangers make way into the small town and create a bit of a disturbance. Amber is a woman that jumps into Charlie's car in the middle of the night, in the middle of the road when he almost accidentally hits her coming into town. She is flighty, abrasive, and has somehow managed to wedge herself into Charlie's life. Unfortunately, Amber ends up dead shortly after being included in a recent will reading that dumped some big news on this newcomer, and Charlie ends up being the suspect.

I enjoyed this one I did. The writing was well done, very descriptive and warm. Charlie has left Sea Harbor a while ago and it's his first time back after being away. There is a bit of wariness between him, his sister and his aunt so it takes a bit for Charlie to try and mend this relationship in hopes to begin some healing. I couldn't help but feel a little mad that Nell, his aunt, doubted Charlie at the beginning in light of the events.

The story was done a bit different. Goldenbaum introduces Amber into the story before the murder and really gives the reader a feel for the girl. You can't help but feel sorry for Amber and what she was going through. Her grandmother and her family blamed her for her mother's mistakes and kind of taking it out on her. She suffered and became a sort of a black sheep in the family. It was nice to see Esther, a town resident step up and take care of the girl during her short stay at Sea Harbor. I felt for Amber, I did, she seemed sort of lost and a bit of a tortured soul, misunderstood. When it turns out that she ends up the murder victim, the style that Goldenbaum introduced me to in this book is rare. We meet Amber, and it isn't until almost 100 pages into the book that the murder finally happens and you just feel for you, you can't help it. Or, at least I did.

Outside of that, there were plenty of warmth and friendship that you can't help but adore and admire through the book. This is the first book for me in this series and I guess It could benefit from reading it from the beginning, but for me it did work as a stand-alone. I was able to learn about the characters quickly and it was nice to see how they stick up for each other, especially when it came to try and clear Charlie's death.

There were a few other mysteries connecting to Amber that played a big roll in this book, which I liked. I also liked the whole holiday feel as well. It was definitely worth a read.

The book starts out very differently from most of the books in this series. We first meet Charlie Chambers, regular Izzy's brother, who's been missing from the family for about 10 years. We don't really know who he is at the start, only that he's coming to Sea Harbor to work in the clinic. On his way there, he picks up a young hitchhiker named Amber. Again, at the start we're not sure who she is, just that she's very skittish about being back in Sea Harbor. She even says she hates the place. We eventually find out why and know she has good reason.

When we finally meet the regulars, it's during a storm and a big dance at the community center that supports the clinic. Everyone is surprised that Charlie is back, especially Izzy. Then we find out that Amber has returned to receive an inheritance. She and Charlie become close, but when her body is found, he becomes the top suspect.

The Seaside Knitters have to find out the truth.

It's a pretty good novel, but I would've preferred not to get to know Amber quite so well before she was killed off. It makes it really hard to enjoy the mystery as much when you like the person who gets axed. But that's just a personal preference. I think this is one of the better books in the series so far.
