There are small glimpses and allusions to something that happened in her past but as the reader, you never really know what happened to her. Well in the first installment of Dahlia's story, Blue Dahlia, you get exactly that. Dahlia is living life and loving Rodrigo, her sexy Latin man, and starting to plan a life with him, to establish a future and move to Miami. Dahlia is all in, or so she thinks, and has just one loose end to tie up. She heads to sunny California where she meets with her past, a haunting past in the form of one sexy surfer boy named Shane. I have absolutely loved the Gilded Flowers series so far. Lily's story was totally addictive and I was hooked to each novella.

It's now Lily's twin sister Dahlia's story. Dahlia is the twin that seems to have the bad reputation. The girls come from a well known and respected society family, and have grown up to know all about appearances and doing as they are told. They are incredibly wealthy and have pretty much anything they want. Which isn't always the case, it wasn't with Lily, and it certainly isn't with Dahlia.

When reading lily's stories, Dahlia just seemed like the naughty party girl, who liked to have a lot of fun. We now learn that Dahlia was hiding a big secret and heartache.

The big secret is revealed when Dahlia has to revisit her past, there are things she needs to do and put to rest before she can move on with her life.

It's here we see just who Dahlia is, or used to be, 7 years ago. It's actually quite a sad story, it showed what Dahlia had been through, and why she acted the way she did afterwards. I felt really torn for her and it was a really emotional read.

You'll remember Dahlia from the Gilded Lily trilogy. She wasn't one of my favorite characters then because of the way she tried to prevent a disaster marriage for her identical twin, Lily. Dahlia has always been more of the rebel sister. When she was younger, she left the nest partially to get out from under her parents' thumbs. I suspect the intent was also to agitate her morally questionable mother. Sadly, I have found that D seems to have similar values even if she doesn't want to admit it.

Before committing to move to Miami with Rodrigo, she has to clear up something from her past. She decides to ask her husband for a divorce herself and in person. By going she opens herself up to a painful past and someone she feels was tainted by her family, more specifically her conniving mother. What will happen when she faces her events from long ago?

This is surprisingly one of the more tame installments in the Gilded Flower series. I don't expect that to last long at all. It sets everything up for a showdown in Miami. I'm curious as to whom Dahlia will choose because both men, Rodrigo and Shane have some great qualities. I even initially thought they were both too good for her. After reading this, my dislike for Dahlia has lessened quite a bit. I think her parental influences have molded her into a character with questionable morals but I realize now she tends to do what she does with good intentions even if it raises a few eyebrows. I can't wait to see how her story unfolds.

Dahlia is happy in her relationship with Rodrigo and is planning to move to Miami to solidify her future with him. She knows that there is a pretty big something in her past that is keeping her from being able to move forward with Rodrigo, so she travels to California in an attempt to tie up the loose ends. When she gets there she realizes that things are going to be more complex than she anticipated.

It was hard for me to connect fully to Dahlia because while she has obviously suffered some serious loss in her life, but the way she leaves Rodrigo completely blindsided was pretty tough to sympathize with. Her motives were good, but the whole thing still felt a little thoughtless at times. Shane is a character, who also wasn't really developed fully enough for me to understand the full appeal. These characters are obviously very sexually compatible, but it seemed like the only real change for either of them was the passage of time. It is tough but realistic that in relationships people are often hurt through no fault of their own, but it is still tough to witness. I haven't read the previous books in this series, so it is possible that I would have had stronger context and base understanding of these characters if I had.

Dahlia is certain that her future is with Rodrigo, and that moving to Miami to be with him is the right thing to do. But before she does that she has to face her past, and the one man that will always be a part of it. Facing up to her husband, Shane, is one of the hardest things she's ever done, especially as Dahlia knows she still loves him and yet can't stop thinking about their dead daughter when she looks at him. Though Shane hasn't seen Dahlia in 7 years, he still loves her, and the passion is still there between the two of them, all he needs to do now is to convince Dahlia that there is something there as well...

When I thought about a trilogy about Lily's sister, I wasn't actually expecting anything quite like this for Dahlia. I expected her to have a past but I didn't actually expect that past to be a husband and a dead child, and all the traumas that that entailed. Probably because Dahlia was tarred a bit by the way she was introduced to the series (which definitely wasn't an all that nice way for her twin, Lily).

There was definite chemistry between Shane and Dahlia, though it took me most of the book to decide whether I wanted them together or not, and I'm still not 100% sure. I'm not sure why but there is just something that makes me think that their story isn't quite over, and that there is more to it than meets the eye. So I'm definitely intrigued as to where this is going.

One thing definitely in Shane's favour was that he reintroduced Dahlia to the world of art, meaning that she got back to creating pieces, and considering that that was her passion in life, and that she'd stopped, I think that can only be a good thing. That was definitely conveyed in the way that Dahlia seemed to act when she was painting, or when she was looking at photographs that she has painted.

I'm sure there are more good things coming from the Gilded Flower series, and I'm definitely intrigued to find out what is coming next!
