Having read other works by the author before, I couldn't wait to read *Breathe Again*. At the beginning of the story we get to meet Carrie Malone, a college senior who has been keeping her life busy between her work at the diner and at school. When a handsome stranger walks into the diner one night, living her his Rolex as a tip, Carrie doesn't know what to do. Without giving it much of a thought, Carrie goes on with her only to stumble upon the stranger at a bridge, ready to take his own life. In that moment, nothing else mattered, but to save him, without thinking that her life was about to change forever.

Josh Bennett may be wealthy and young, he could get anything at his beck-and-call, but not even money can cure him from the tragedy that he just suffered. Losing someone can be difficult, and Josh is not sure how to move on. With the intention of losing his own life, he walks to the bridge, only to be saved by the girl from the diner. Having both suffered tremendously in the past, they turn to each other for comfort. But soon things start to escalate between them and they began to wonder whether their feelings for each other are real or if it's just the pain that has been pulling them closer.

I absolutely loved reading this book, it was sweet and a total page-turner. The characters have their pasts that they're trying to get past from, but neither imagined how difficult it was going to be. Luckily they were able to find each other, but their growing chemistry and lust for one another is pulling them closer each time they're near each other. As a college student, Carrie worries constantly about her college loans and bills. She has a tiny apartment that she is proud of, and while she is struggling to get by, she doesn't want to go back to the life that she had at home. She is determined to make a name for herself, and move on from her past. Meanwhile, Josh is a young and attractive guy whose life spirals out of control after he gets married to someone he thought he loved. Now that things have drastically changed for him, he doesn't want to continue on living, until he meets Carrie. Together they go through ups and downs, but at the end of the day they have each other to turn to. The story had a nice flow that kept me reading non-stop. There were times when the characters would get me a bit frustrated, but at the end of it all it really came together very well. The ending will definitely leave you wanting for more, though it ended on a really nice note.
