Just before they are ready to go a visitor turns up with unexpected news. They are all shocked at the news that Cassandrhea Tibbins brings. She tells them how the family who run The Empowered, a newspaper, are continuing to run more and more stories about Willow and painting her in a bad light. How they know some of the things they know, shows there may be a spy somewhere and because of that Cassabdrhea has made the choice that Willow must be hidden from everyone to ensure her safety.

If Willow thought she was lonely before going to the school, she finds herself even more so once she is there. Being unable to show her true self, due to the people after her, the pressure, the fear and the isolation are taking it's toll. Willow is not only trying to survive the pressures of school and without friends, but she trying to fight to stay alive. Willow finds that old friends are now enemies and evil won't stop till they find her. Willow is learning more about herself and her magic and surprises them all but is she revealing to much too soon?

No one must know who she is or where she is. She needs to find out quickly who she can trust yet again when Cornelius' plans for her become more insane and deadly. The prophecy she must decipher this time and seemingly alone is more of a riddle than ever. Will she be able to solve it? Will she be able to save herself? This is not a stand - alone book and should be read in the correct order which is as follows: A Keeper’s Destiny, A Halloween’s Curse, Frost Bitten, Sleeping Sands, Deadly Perceptions and Finding Balance

In Sleeping Sands we see more of the infrastructure of what is going on and how things are moving forward to keep people under the King’s thumb. King Cornelius is losing his mind and everyone is feeling his wrath. “Can we not find a new world to conquer for you my lord? There must be something you would like your children to do for you?” His obsession with Willow is over the top. Revisionist history is something that the king is trying to achieve. He will do anything within his power to facilitate his need to gain control of Willow, including going down an evil path.

It steps away from the holiday themes of the previous two books, *A Halloween's Curse* and *Frost Bitten*. This came as a relief as, whilst I enjoyed those books and the clever ways King worked the festive traditions into her fantasy world, I was not ready for the Easter Bunny to be kidnapped by a race of sinister eggs.

As *Sleeping Sands* begins, our protagonist Willow is preparing to go to a magical boarding school, knowing

that she will be cut off from her friends who will be attending different schools. As a fan of other series such as Children of the Red King and Harry Potter, I was very excited for a whole new magic school and Sleeping Sands did not disappoint. My only complaint is that, with so much focus on Willow in Sleeping Sands, we didn't get a glimpse into any of the schools that the others were attending. Not seeing them, however, helped us to share in Willow's isolation.

Although we didn't get to see much of the usual cast, at Sleeping Sands Willow (disguised as a boy, deceptively named Will) is in a group with four elves. They make an exciting addition to the cast, teaching us more about the history and customs of another world (also all the elves are essentially bisexual and that makes me so happy I hope we actually get some elvish romance in the coming books). They work well with Willow, having far superior knowledge and skills in some areas and much to learn from her in others. I particularly like how the chemistry between the five of them develops over the book!

With Willow's exceptional magical abilities she does, to an extent, seem too perfect in this book. Even in the areas she supposedly struggles with she seems to have natural abilities. It has the potential to get a bit annoying, but then also means that less time is devoted to the basic learning stuff and more to the drama and more exciting displays of magic.

I give this book five out of five stars. I'm already thinking of a list of friends to recommend this series to - if you like young adult fantasy consider yourself added to that list! It is definitely worth reading the books in order to get the full story (and don't be put off by the festive themes of the earlier books - they are still fantastic stories and I managed to thoroughly enjoy them in the heat of the summer!).

Sleeping Sands is the fourth book in The Portal Prophecies Series By C.A King. This is a YA paranormal/fantasy full of action, adventure, drama, some mystery and intrigue. This series is full of all sorts of mystical, magical and fanciful creatures and beings- which Ms. King has lovingly crafted using myths, legends and tall tales as her inspiration.

Willow and her friends are separated, all sent to different schools that are hidden on the main world. ‘The Empowered’ continues to print very damaging and false articles about Willow, placing her in a bad light and getting everyone questioning everything she does. So the decision is made to hide her away from everyone. Willow feels completely isolated, unsupported and helpless. When old enemies surface, Willow has no choice but to face them alone- without the support of her friends. She’s not sure she can do it alone and it takes all her courage to step out on her own.

“Willow let out a lengthy sigh as she picked up the newspapers in front of her. They were riddled with articles about the camp - each one trying to answer who they were and what they were trying to accomplish - all with the ability to leave negative impressions after reading them. King Cornelius' deranged depravity and instability become even more evident through this story. Willow also has much danger to contend with as assassins are on her tail. She also needs to be vigilant about not disclosing anything about herself because she doesn't know who she can trust, she no longer feels she knows who her friends are- and with new enemies to deal with, she has a lot to contend with. Then there is the matter of deciphering the latest prophecy, on her own.

As with the other stories in this series, this book contains all manner of wondrous beings and life forms. I have discovered that Ms. King has a real flair for her vivid descriptions and strong, detailed characterisations of both humans, humanoids, and all types of 'creatures'.
