When you read a book titled "Bound to Serve" you know what you are getting. At least you should. And what you get from this is exactly what you are expecting...and maybe a little more, as the writing and the characters are also engaging, the setting is amusing, and Bridget and her inability to be a "good" submissive is hilarious.

Condor is likeable, Bridget is fun. Both are capable agents, and this adds an enjoyable element to it, as neither of them is in over their heads, although Bridget is not as experienced.

The writing is fun and engaging, the story is enjoyable, and you like the characters. Really, what more could you want?

It is BDSM light, with some elements of the lifestyle encountered and discussed, but nothing too dark, so it should be fine for all readers.

The idea of "Mission Magic" is something that you are just going to have to read the book to understand.

Bound To Serve is a well written romantic action suspense with a unique plot that ends with a HEA and a slight cliffhanger!

I'm new to Julie Castle's books so going into Bound To Serve I had no idea what to expect and I admit this book ended up being so much more than I expected from the blurb. Bound To Serve is a well written romantic action suspense with a plot that definitely takes on a unique perspective; I honestly thought it would just be another typical special ops type action romance but it was so much more than that. From the beginning I was drawn in to this book and eager to figure out where it was going to lead, although, be warned, not all issues are answered in this book, leaving readers on a slight cliffhanger to set up the next book despite what appears to be a HEA.

Bound To Serve is told from both Condor and Bridget's perspectives, giving a wider understanding of both characters and their thoughts. From the moment these two likeable characters are introduced, there is a clear chemistry between the pair, albeit a bit feisty with their strong opinions on a mission they both are working on from different angles. Bridget is a strong female, witty and a more than capable agent with her intelligence, whilst, Condor is a dominant alpha male that also had a caring and strong protective side that clearly shows as the story progresses. Both characters were well developed and evolved over the course of the book, especially with having to figure out the lines of reality and simulated moments for their mission. What worked well throughout in showcasing the developing relationship Bridget and Condor built up, despite being over a short period of time, was the contrast of their tender moments and when both tried to focus on the mission at hand and the roles they should be playing.

The book has a good writing style and flow with a steady yet fast pace throughout with the majority of Bound To Serve set over only a couple of days. There are some predictable parts to the plot and some twists thrown in that I didn't fully expect, adding to the well thought-out plot. I personally found that the author managed to get a good natural balance with the romance and the suspense, especially with moving along the relationship between the couple in a way that fit with the storyline perfectly. Also, the vivid descriptions allowed the reader to be engaged and picture the scenes that were playing out clearly. Bound To Serve has some very hot and steamy sexual scenes that also incorporate some dominating/BDSM elements but nothing hardcore that most erotic romance readers won't have read before. The only reason I didn't rate this any higher was because there were a few little missing words/grammar errors etc throughout. It wasn't enough to put me off the book but enough to be noticed here and there.

Overall, if you enjoy a good romantic suspense, definitely don't hesitate to give this book a read! I can't wait to read the next book in the series and find out what will happen!

I first want to say I love finding new author's and this was the first time I have read anything from Mrs. Castle. The description of this book is what really caught my attention and made me want to read it.

I loved Condor or 'The Ghost' as he goes by. I thought he was mysterious, dominate, possessive, sweet, caring and kind. He was definitely a guy that took his undercover work seriously. Though I have to say I wish we could have gotten to know him better. I felt like we didn't really get to 'know' his character. We just kind of got to know what he was into.

I found Bridget a mixture between likable and a bit annoying. You're either going to really like her or you're just not going to like her at all. Bridget is trying to avenge her ex-fiance's death, by taking down the man she's convinced is responsible for her ex's death. I found Bridget a bit hard headed and stubborn at times, she definitely didn't seem to follow order's easily (she seemed to want to be in charge at all times). Well, wasn't this an interesting story. A little bit of mystery, a little bit of fun, a little bit of BDSM and a whole lot of Condor.

I'll be totally honest with you ... I'm still not sure if I truly like Bridget. She's a woman with a chip in her shoulder, didn't know how to take orders and definitely topped from the bottom. Now, there are times I enjoy reading about Brats but it seemed out of place in this story. She demanded to be part of the team to take down Perez but then sabotaged the mission every chance she got. If she listened to what Condor told her to do, she wouldn't have put the mission in jeopardy. But, she did. And, then she really enjoyed the punishment that was bestowed on her by the one man who finally showed her what sex was all about.

Condor was interesting, sexy, dominant and powerful. He was the epitome of what you would think a dominant male would be. And, he really enjoyed the punishments he gave Bridget. There was a part of him that even enjoyed her brattiness at times. What he didn't like was the way she disobeyed him around every turn regarding Perez. He was also a little bit insecure when he found out her thought-to-be-dead ex-fiancé was alive. He knew that what was between him and Bridget was getting real and didn't know how she was going to take the news. Would she run back to him and switch sides like he did or would she see what was in front of her and embrace both him and her submissive side?

As for the mission and the storyline ... it was really interesting. It kind of reminded me about stories I heard about an island in the Caribbean that held private parties called "Hedonism" and, from what I am told (no, I didn't experience it myself), anything and everything was fair game. The only difference between this island and Hedonism was that there were no terrorists showing up for a good time.

I really enjoyed reading Bound to Serve and Julie Castle did a really good job of keeping me interested in how the story would turn out. Now, complete honesty here, I was not thrilled with the way the mission on the island ended. But, it's a series so I guess we'll have to wait and see what really did happen with Perez. I loved that, in the end, Bridget came to her senses and realized what she really wanted and went after it. It was actually the first time in the book that I really liked her.

I really struggled with this one--I wanted to like it; the premise was so close to some of my favorite undercover spy-type plots (ie all the episodes of Scarecrow and Mrs. King when they went undercover and had to pretend to be a couple) but I just had a really hard time taking the main characters seriously. Neither one of them acted like seasoned agents (and okay, Bridget wasn't, exactly, but she was supposed to be a professional in the field at least) but instead were moody, hormone-soaked teenagers for most of the book. How did they expect to get any work done? DNF at 75%.

Bridget, a new Delta Star field agent, is determined to capture a known terrorist. A terrorist responsible for her ex-fiancé's death years ago. Yes, she may have had some not so nice thoughts about James due to his lying and cheating on her, but she never wanted him dead. Upon being summoned to the Director's office she meets the legendary agent known as Condor.

Ross, aka Condor, is the agent called in when everything else has failed. He's an iceman and always accomplishes his missions. Yet, there's something about Bridget that sets him on fire. When she pushes to be the junior agent to go undercover with him, and he finally accepts, as his submissive, things go from a simmer to explosive very quickly.

As they're going undercover at a resort, a resort which caters to the kink the terrorist they're after likes, Condor will be doing what comes natural to him...being a Dom. However, Bridget isn't naturally a submissive, or is she? Condor must quickly train her in what will be expected of her. While as is Condor's rule, all sexual situations required for missions are simulated, as in faked. But what will they do with the very real attraction burning between them?

Can Condor and Bridget maintain their covers and complete their mission? Will they explore the connection between them after their assignment is over? If so, what about the strict no fraternization rule for Delta Star employees? What happens when Bridget comes face to face with her past? Will Condor and Bridget get their HEA? Or did their time together always have a deadline?

One-click now to find out. This story had an interesting premise and gave quite a twist on how the main characters got together. It's full of suspense, sexy times, betrayal, and a love that could last forever.

However, I will say this, as for my own personal preference, even though it was part of the cover the main characters had to play, I really could've done without each of them having to cozy up to another person,

including each of them having to kiss, and act like they enjoyed it, said other person. I do not care to read about the main characters with anyone beside each other, especially after they've been together and they both know there's something between them. It was done throughout the whole book and honestly, it lessened the connection we're supposed to envision the main characters having. Also, I didn't like the fact that it's pointed out that Condor has trained submissives before for missions. Yes, I know he's a Dom and that's what they do, however, it instantly made me, and I'm still wondering as I type my review, what all that training entailed. I know he had a rule about sexual situations only being fake, and he never wavered on that until Bridget, but I still can't help but wonder exactly how they were simulated, and that curiosity again lessened the connection between the couple for me. Also, towards the beginning before starting the assignment, Condor orders "the usual" from a store that caters to sexual preferences. However, I do like that he orders new accessories for each situation. Again, this makes me wonder about the previous times and seems to make Bridget no different than anyone else before her. I know she does become more, but I at no point what the woman I know will become the love of his life to appear to be like every other woman in his past. While I did like the book, I definitely would've enjoyed it more without the circumstances I previously mentioned. I need to feel, and believe whole heartedly in, the connection between the main couple and unfortunately, here I did not. But again, that could just be me. I recommend that anyone interested give this book a try as it's highly likely they'll love it. However, if your tastes run similar to mine in the "I prefer not to read that about that" category, please be warned.

Feisty, red head Bridget fights to get paired up with ghost operative, Condor, on the mission that she has worked on for three long years. To get the man that killed her ex in a bombing.

When she finds out she will have to play the part of a submissive in order to stay on the case, she has to prove to Condor that she can do it. He doesn't think she can but hopes she will. He throws out a challenge right there in the office that she will have to enter the compound naked. So Bridget decides to start to strip right there to prove him wrong. He gives the OK and they leave immediately.

Condor is six foot five and a fine specimen of a man. So much so that they talk about him in her department and have nick named him Dino the dinosaur. Partly because they would all like to be with him and partly because he is old school and works with no one. Bound to Serve is a story with an interesting plot - Condor, a ghost agent is tasked to bring down the bad guy Perez, by infiltrating his BDSM resort. As such, he needs a 'slave' to go with him, and Bridget convinces her boss to let her be the one, because Perez is responsible for the death of her ex. (They'd broken up because he'd cheated on her, but she still feels responsible for his death). The story blends action with some super sexy scenes as Condor and Bridget track the killer. Bridget fails miserably at being a slave to her 'master' - she's far too opinionated and defiant, but can't deny that pretending with him does turn her on. Having read several BDSM books, I found this one to be fairly stereotypical, lots of spanking scenes and other light bondage, but not always following the 'rules' of real BDSM relationships. (Perhaps it suffers from a bit of 50 Shades- it is?) It's an insta-love story too, both Condor and Bridget admitting they love each other while barely having spent any time together. There are some good twists and turns to the story though, and the action scenes are okay. Its got a happy for now ending, and gives the impression that there is more to tell in their story. I received an ARC of this title in exchange for an honest review and here it is: 4 stars.

Bound to Serve is the very promising first book in a new romantic suspense series by what appears to be this author's first novel, and as first novels go, she's certainly off to a good start. For those expecting a typical romantic suspense novel, boy, are you in for a surprise.

Bridget Jamison, was recently promoted to field agent at Delta Star, a black ops agency. Six years earlier, her fiance and fellow agent, James, was killed during an op that went bad and Bridget has been blaming herself for his death ever since. She's soon to be paired with Condor (Ross Longtree), also known at the agency as

The Ghost, and sent on an assignment to catch the man who killed her fiance, Simon Perez, an international criminal who has been eluding capture for far too long.

Intelligence reports indicate that Perez frequents an exclusive resort, and Bridget and Condor are to infiltrate the resort as a couple, but there's a catch. This is no ordinary resort--this is a BDSM resort for the rich, powerful and sexually kinky. Condor almost always works alone, he's into kink and will have no problem acting as a Dom, but Bridget hasn't a clue. She's a well-trained, spunky agent, and doesn't like taking orders, and so Condor has to train her to believably act as his submissive. This is not an easy task, since Bridget is out to prove herself a valuable asset to the agency, exact revenge for her finance's death, and she's no shrinking violet. Delta Star prohibits relationships between its agents, and the sex between agents on an op is all supposed to be simulated, or so Bridget thinks. This is the point at which I need to advise you that this novel is definitely written for the age 18+ reader. The sex between these two is definitely not simulated, and turn up your air conditioning, because as the story plays out in the hunt for Perez, the relationship between Bridget and Condor takes off like a five-alarm fire.

Ms. Castle has written a sizzling hot, fast-paced and suspense-filled thriller of a romance novel, with interesting and well-portrayed characters. I especially liked the touches of humor and sass from Bridget and her inability to follow orders. If I had to choose one thing I'd change about this novel, it's that I would have liked a little more backstory on Condor, who was certainly sexy as all get-out and a very intriguing character. All in all, this is one impressive debut novel, and I'm eager to read the next novels in this series.

Ross Longtree, code name Condor. He's Delta Star's cleanup man, the one who succeeds at the spying jobs when others fail, when there's trouble, the Iceman cometh. Delta Star is a secret government agency, and Bridget Jamison was recently promoted from computer analyst to field agent. Her fiancé, James Clayton, another agent was killed on the job, and Bridget holds herself responsible. Nobody knew they were having an affair, and even though he cheated on her, she needs to find the man who was responsible for James' death: Simon Perez, an international terrorist. Bridget has been working the Perez case for three years, she thinks she might have located him, when she is called in the agency director's office. She will have to work with Condor if she is to remain on the Perez case. She doesn't want to share, but it's that or she's taken off the case. Bridget and Condor had crossed each other's path briefly along the years, they're both attracted to each other, but relationships are forbidden at the agency, so neither did anything about it. Bridget is a very assertive woman, Condor is a Dom, which will not be easy to deal with as they are to infiltrate Perez's island compound as a Dom and his submissive.

BOUND TO SERVE starts off really well, I loved the covert atmosphere, however the blurb never mentioned that this was a BDSM romantic suspense; had I known it was BDSM, I would not have opted to read it, as erotica and BDSM are pretty much coming out of my ears these days and I rather dislike so-called alphas, them being all too commonplace as well.

Nevertheless, BOUND TO SERVE is a fast-paced read, well-written, the BDSM and suspense elements are dealt with competently, I was however extremely pleasantly surprised at the romance itself. I loved that Ms.

Castle's characters remained true to themselves throughout, the dynamics never changed: Bridget is definitely not a submissive-type of woman, Condor is absolutely a dominant male, and yet both are open-minded faced with the inevitable, that their attraction is real. I really enjoyed their relationship; obviously there were personality conflicts to begin with, but they were dealt with intelligently by the author. There were none of the issues I expected, and while I felt somewhat dejected at first that Condor was yet again another domineering male, he really grew on me; Bridget, I loved right from the start. The sex scenes are sizzling, respectful and at time, quite playful. So, if you like some spying games with your BDSM and a really nice romance, I do recommend **BOUNDED TO SERVE**. At least, you will know to expect BDSM!
