When he confront the young man, he senses something different about him. Being a Private investigator he immediately recognizes the youth is a runaway and decides to reach out and help him.

Adam never in a million years thought he would be offered a job and more or less friendship from the man he tried to steal from. When he realises that Ronin is serious, Adam gratefully takes a chance and allows Ronin to help him with his fragile life.

Adam moves in with Ronin and learns the PI business. Over the years he works his way up in the business and thrives on Ronin's friendship and guidance. He hides his homosexuality from everyone (it is the reason he was kicked out of his home to begin with) and his deep love and admiration for Ronin, who is a straight man.

I loved this story. The friendship and the love that develops between Ronin and Adam was beautiful, reconfirming that love has no boundaries and sees no gender.

If you are offended by M/M sexual activities, this book is not for you. Otherwise, enjoy every minute of it...I did.

This story was TERRIBLE! BEYOND terrible, actually.

I have never wished that I could scrub my eyeballs and bleach my brain more than I did at about 55-60% in this story (and that's saying something, because there was plenty of terrible writing and freaky plot points before that as well).

It's truly not worth my time to write a complete review, so here it is in a nutshell:

What started out as an intriguing and unique set up devolved *very* quickly through frequent and frustrating time progressions. The scenes moved through time so quickly that nothing had a chance to settle or resonant with me as a reader (parts that had potential to be poignant and/or bring the heart stabbies practically made me yawn with indifference). The characters were two-dimensional tools with next to no REAL chemistry (the sexy times were not even remotely sexy and, in parts, downright creepy). The dialogue was so atrocious

As fate will have it, Adam one day targets security expert and business owner, Rhone Quinn. Instead of turning Adam in to the police, Rhone gets a feeling about Adam and decides to offer the young man a job and a chance to begin a new life. Over the years, not only does Adam prove he is trustworthy but he becomes a true asset to Quinn Security. Eventually, Rhone and his brother Canin make Adam a full-fledged partner. Equality is great and Adam is grateful for all the Quinn brothers have done for him but he hides a secret: he has fallen deeply in love with Rhone, who's straight. Rhone and Adam, however, ultimately find their way to each other and their HEA.

This book had a lot of potential and I enjoyed the characters but in the end it fell short for me. Why? A couple reasons. Bottom line: a charming tale that had a lot of potential but fell short IMHO. However, I liked the characters enough to continue this series.

I feel so let down and disappointed in this novel, I can't stop fuming about it in my own mind. So, here I am.

Let me preface this somewhat unkind review by saying that normally, I'm of the belief that if you can't say anything good, you shouldn't say anything at all. Silence can speak volumes. Sometimes, however, you just have to speak up.

I've always been on the fence where Ms. Dane's work is concerned. I know she's a very popular author and has many, many fans that are extremely happy with her efforts. And I realize no writer's approach is going to appeal to all readers. I've probably read a half dozen of Ms. Dane's novels, so I can't plead ignorance to her technique or style. Not sure why I feel so ticked off about this novel in particular, but here it is! My apologies in advance if I offend any of Ms. Dane's staunchest fans.

The first 3/4 of the novel had me hooked. The structure was interesting and handled quite well, I thought.

The pacing was nicely controlled, details of the years passing unveiled with a subtle restraint (with the exception of jarring pseudo mutual-mastro-sex scene) that served the story well, building atmosphere and investing us in the lives of Adam and Rhone.

My heart broke for Adam when he finally decided that his unrequited feelings for Rhone were too much to deal with in close quarters. When he moves out of the home they'd shared as friends and colleagues for almost a decade the sense of loss was palpable.

It had all the makings of an emotionally powerful and satisfying love story. I let myself wallow in the sweet sadness of the temporary angst, knowing that the big emotional payoff would come. That moment when the two lovers FINALLY see the light and confess their true feelings to one other. Bliss.

And THEN Ms. Dane brought us to the present day part of the story *sigh*
