Usually, this is a death knell for me. This was not the case in this book. I was kept engaged throughout the story. My only complaint is I did not want the book to end. I hope the author is planning a sequel. I would love to read more about the hero and heroine.

It is none other than, Cian, Nick, and Thea who she had met in college. She was unfriendly to them and they were unfriendly to her. Cian was her nemesis. Cian constantly flirted and taunted her. Nick and Thea quickly approach her and call a truce. It is challenging to work with Cian, but she does not want to lose her job.

One day, Skye and Cian are walking to meet up with Nick and Thea for lunch and come across quite by accident Cian's girlfriend cheating on him. Completely out of the blue, Skye pretends to be Cian's girlfriend. She does not believe anyone deserves that kind of humiliation. They eventually get to the restaurant. Skye is told that they might have to pretend to be together for awhile. She walks out of the restaurant. She never thought about the unintended consequences of her actions. After she leaves, Cian has an epiphany and realizes he is in love with her. He goes in search of her and finds her on the beach. He is a gentleman and tells her there is no need to continue the ruse. She refuses so he proposes they have a real relationship. Cian, in his mind, knows this is his only chance to make her fall in love with him. He is not going to mess this up.

The rest of the book deals with the evolution of Skye and Cian's relationship. Also, two secondary relationships are resolved.

Overall, a great debut contemporary romance with a charming hero and an innocent heroine.

Holding Out for Sky follows the unlikely romance of Skye and Cian. Skye has just started a new job where she finds that she knows all three of her new teammates, and one in particular is the guy who drove her nuts in college. There's definitely potential for them from the get-go. Their constant bickering and teasing leaves no wonder where passion would be found.

Skye struggles to open herself to others, but she is fiercely loyal to those who pass her barriers. She seems a little naive for her age at points, but she has a rough past, which explains why she holds herself separate from people and why certain things are new ground for her.

Like Skye, some of the other characters acted a little younger than their ages. For instance, I was surprised at one character's refusal to stand up to her father, as in the book, all characters seem to be in their mid-twenties, in careers, and more than capable of making life decisions.

There is a varied cast of characters, and two other couplings that take place throughout the book, so it is kind of like getting three romance stories in one. That being said, this allows for lots of ups and downs, several misunderstandings, and quite a bit of hilarity.

Overall, the themes of the book seem to be loyalty and not judging things at face value. Even with the drama, I would recommend it to those who aren't looking for something dark and full of angst. It's a lighthearted, easy read with likable characters.

The actions sometimes come off more along the lines of a teenage relationship. The problems seem more high school than workplace. It doesn't do much to detract from the story, it's just a bit of a nitpick. And it could be that that's just me. I am out of my element with this story.
