I'd been wanting to upgrade my son to an "older" bible, as he's been getting too old VeggieTales one. ;-)

This one is perfect! I love that he has the full Word, the same text that I have in my bible. He feels good about having this new bible, and the cover looks "guy." He loves the "grossology" sections, which expand on something from a passage that is truly gross. And the "What's the Big Deal" sections that appear every

four pages give further thought into passages.

He knows that it really doesn't matter what kind of bible he has, that reading God's Word is all that truly matters, but I think this particular bible makes him smile and go looking to connect in his own 10-year-old way.

Cute cover. My daughter loves it. At eight, she's a little young for the "Oh I get it" sidebars and "Dream Girl" devotionals, but she likes the "Is There a Little Wise Kid in You" ones and the sporadic quizzes. I like that there's a brief intro page at the beginning of each book that explains in kid terms what the book is about and gives some highlights. I love that she has the same NIV version of the Word that I have, so we can each read from our own bibles and have the same text.

This is a bible she can grow up with and love until the cover wears off. And I think that someday she will read those longer sidebars and devotional passages and really enjoy them because they are deep and thoughtful.

This too is loaded with extras to help with comprehension and retention. Instead of the princessy things, we have Check It Out and Grossology – what boy won't gravitate to that one? When my son's older (he's currently 6), I look forward to giving this to him and helping him discover the Word of God.

This is an excellent boys study bible for the boy in your life who is between being a teen and a little kid - a great transition bible for this time.

Boys will like all the neat features. In fact I don't remember seeing a section or inset called "Grossology" in other tween study bible. This actually made me smile and of course my 8 year old boy found it to be the neatest feature to him. What boy does not want to learn some disgustingly gross fact that we often over look - like that a fly in the perfume would rot and make the who vat of perfume stink to high heaven?

Among this there are other insets of greater biblical teaching. Including: "What's the Big Deal" - this section points out key biblical people and stories. "Check it out" - this is a facts section about things in the bible, a great section to acquire biblical trivia knowledge. "Maikin' It Real" - this is a great section to use as a conversation starter if you study the bible with your child - this section helps to show how to apply the story or verse to everyday life. There are also verses that are highlighted as key verses to memorize.

This is one of those fun bibles that is great for boys.

How about this NIV Boys Bible with orange and blue instead, the design is awesome like a tool box – whatever that diamond plated metal is called (the Engineerd is impressed). So in this one, skip relating how girls are to women in the Bible and jump right into Grossology – who knew that you could read about impaling skulls with some blood and gore? Job had been the Big Shot of his hometown. People listened when he spoke, moved out of his way in crowds, and asked him to kiss their babies (well, maybe not that!). He even cared for the poor and sick (29:11-17) Yet that changed radically when Job lost everything. People didn't run to his side to help him. They mocked him; young men even spit in his face (30:10)! Almost overnight, Job went from being a celebrity to being the town joke.

Sometimes jealousy and pride gets the best of people. We Want what someone else has, so when they lost it, we're secretly happy. But think about this: If the best goalie on your soccer team gets injured, it hurts the whole team, not just him. When hardship falls on someone else, don't secretly rejoice or turn on him. Treat all people with kindness. Don't despise people when their fortunes change; it might happen to you someday.

Of course, there are many more other fun tid bits to help teach your sons about the word of God and the Bible.
