I really enjoyed this latest Waltz release. We met our "beauty" as a down-on-her-luck girl in California who has an ongoing online romance with a foreigner. They finally met when she agrees to marry her. I initially thought this premise was rather benign and typical for some romances but the book quickly shifted into an adventure I never expected or have read before. Our "beast" is all man, macho, headstrong, dominant yet romantic and sensitive at heart. The secondary characters, mainly Alex, kept me on my toes with whether to root for him or despise him. And this delicate balance really kept me engaged throughout the read.

I only had two main qualms with the read: First, I was sometimes annoyed by Lily's rash opinions of the conflict and lack of desire to learn more. She never really delved into the culture. I understood she had restrictions but still it annoyed me slightly in the early part of the book. She warmed to me, but August was an instant favorite. Secondly, I wish there was a definitive epilogue that looked farther forward in the couple's future. But these were rather subjective opinions and do not detract from the skillfulness of the writing or artful storyline. Especially the inclusion of their correspondence, scattered throughout the book.

There is nothing in Lily's future except a bleak question mark. Life used to be full of opportunities for Lily, but somehow her only choices now were to continue living in destitute poverty in an unsafe warehouse or to accept a stranger's marriage proposal. August and Lily had met online and every choice Lily makes brings her closer to August; a man who hears her confess her deepest fears and most intimate fantasies. But August didn't want to save Lily, he wants to marry her. Lily wonders why her, and can she really trust him, or will it cost her. Every detail about August hints at power and wealth and while he cannot give Lily a perfect life, he promises to make it a better one. August's father, Luis, is a powerful man; a general in the military, serving a dictator, President Cortés. Now Lily knew the reason for August's tight-lipped secrecy; while she had trusted him, he had lied and brought her into the country illegally, even if he did make her feel loved.
