In the author's biography, it says that "her favorite stories are those that inspire laughter through tears." That is a good way to describe this story. Ellie comes back to town because her father was found in the park during an Alzheimer moment; even though he doesn't recognize her most of the time, one time he does, and he asks her to take over running the family funeral home. Okay, that's a first for me - a heroine in a funeral home. I wasn't turned off, though, because I was already invested in the story. The Marine from the title is Finn, who grew up with Ellie - they were "frenemies" - they both were smarter than all the other kids in school, and they taunted each other as they got ready for each test or contest.

After some hanky-panky at the end of their senior high school year, they lose touch until Ellie comes back to town; she finds that Finn now owns a funeral home in the same *small* town! Both characters are dealing with very serious issues related to their families, and that part is heart wrenching. Because they desperately need each of their family's funeral homes to win the town's business, they see each other a lot as they fight to win.

Finn "...[has] the trimmed, toned body of a warrior. The sexily mussed hair of a man who liked to take life easy. The strong, chiseled face of a Greek God. And a voice that could melt butter." AND this ex-Marine rides a motorcycle!

The book's story was unusual. The characters had jobs that I've never seen in a romance before, and they were dealing with family issues that were deeply serious. However, there is laughter, romance, and heart in this story. And...some very sexy scenes as well. I have to admit that I cried in a few parts near the end, and I was rooting for them (and yelling at them) to have their HEA ending. The depth of the story, the idiosyncrasies of the two leads and the many characters around them, and the idea that there CAN be laughter through tears made this a good read for me.

Ellie's father is dealing with the final stages of Alzheimer's disease, and Finn's mother has finally agreed to

move out of his abusive father's home, and into his home. So of course, they both have **HUGE** reasons why they want their own funeral business to **STAY** in business. Of course, the solution to their problem seemed pretty obvious to me from the beginning of the story, but since they both come from jaded pasts when it comes to love and families, they are blind to this, and immediately dive into the competition of their lives...as well as the affair of their lives!

This was a very sweet romance. The non-stop competition between Elli and Finn that has lasted their entire lives remains as heated as ever when Elli comes back to town to help save the funeral home business her father owns (even though she has no personal desire to own a funeral home herself) when he falls sick. Finn has opened a competing funeral home and when it's a small town, there clearly isn't going to be enough business in town for both to succeed.

Both main characters had incredibly strong reasons to survive and see their business thrive in their town. I loved the competitiveness that led to several interesting ad campaigns. Elli of course initially has the edge there because she's in ad marketing to begin with (and her marketing job includes marketing for Tidy Whitez...adult diapers).

I found her larger story, with watching her dad go downhill in the final stages of Alzheimer's to be heart-rending, especially at the very end just before the resolution of both the funeral home conflict and the Elli/Finn romance issue. Having watched my mom with a similar illness, Ms. Meier's characterization of Elli's dad just about broke my heart with the memories of my mom's struggle with dimension and the very end when you have to make those end-of-life decisions for your loved ones.

Finn's family was no less interesting, with his bully of a father and the mother he and his brothers have finally intervened to help save from an abusive marriage. His final play to gain Elli's love was very sweet and if I were the type to love over-the-top gestures of love and adoration from my spouse, I wish my husband would do something like what Finn does the next time we're having difficulties resolving an issue between us.

Very good, very emotional book, with a setting I haven't encountered before - a pair of funeral homes. Ellie works for an ad agency in Pittsburgh and has just been awarded a big account when she gets an emergency call from the police in her hometown. Her father has been found wandering around town, disoriented and taken to the hospital. When she arrives in Harmony Hills, she finds that he has been hiding his Alzheimer's from her. Now he can no longer live alone, but must go to a nursing home, leaving her in charge of the business. She can't just close it because she needs the money for his expenses, but she is also committed to the ad campaign. To make matters worse, she discovers her old school frenemy, Finn, has come home and opened his own funeral home, putting McDermott's in danger.

Finn finished his time in the Marines and came home, ready to face the demons that sent him running after high school. His funeral home is starting to do well, but there's not enough business for two in town, so he is trying to buy out McDermott's. He needs to succeed in order to take care of his mother, and having Ellie show up and take over puts a crimp in his plans.

Ellie and Finn had been competitors all through school, always vying for the top score or position. They were friends of a sort, always able to be themselves with each other. Each of them had issues with their lives in the small town and couldn't wait to leave. Ellie always felt that she was the object of pity and gossip after her mother was killed in a car accident with her lover. Finn is hiding the fact that his highly respected by the town father abuses Finn, his brothers, and their mother. Attraction that had been building between them explodes on a night when Finn came looking for comfort, leaving both unable to deal with the aftermath. Each of them views their encounter in a different way.

Ellie and Finn are thrown back into competition when she agrees to her father's request that she run things. Though they try to keep away from each other, their attraction is stronger than ever. Though each needs to win this competition, they are able to keep it mostly friendly. But each encounter fans the flames of their attraction, until they decide that maybe they can keep business and pleasure separate. Of course, that never works and this is no exception. Though the solution is obvious, their views on relationships have been affected by those of their parents and neither is looking to repeat those mistakes.

I ached for Ellie throughout the book as she tried to deal with her father's rapid decline. It was especially heartbreak at the end, as she deals with both that and her feelings for Finn. He has his moments of obliviousness that nearly ruin everything before he finally sees the truth. I loved his big moment as he makes his desperate attempt to prove his love to Ellie. It's all wrapped up in an epilogue that shows there's more to their love than just heat.

I loved the secondary characters who added another layer of depth to the story. Ellie's father and the story of how he carried on after his wife's death, and the pain of watching his decline. I loved Finn's mom and seeing her go from broken to strong was fantastic. Ellie's staff at the funeral home were her saviors, and I especially liked BB. Though she seemed to be quite the airhead at the beginning, Ellie quickly discovered there was quite a brain under that hair. The Dinner Belles went from being the source of Ellie's teenage pain to some of her greatest supporters.

There were parts of the book that had me in tears, especially at the end. There were others that had me laughing out loud, most notably the fundraiser and the dunk tank. There were also a couple places that had me fanning myself from the heat coming off the pages. Now I can't wait to read the books for Finn's brothers.

This is one of those books that defies the old adage "you can't go home again." In *Her Summer with the Marine*, we see two high school rivals returning home for different reasons both after being chased out of town by demons they'd dealt with for a good part of their lives. Now facing off for business in this small town, these two must deal with their teenage actions that left one feeling used and the other comforted; one parent in a health crisis and the other trying to regain her life, and the undeniable chemistry they have for one another in what seems an impossible situation. This book is not a light and fluffy romance, it deals with some real issues and while the hero and heroine do manage to find their way to one another it's not without a lot of stumbling along the way.

My heart is breaking for Ellie McDermott, the heroine, as she returns home to find that her father has been battling Alzheimer's on his own for no telling how long. Forced to place him in a care facility and run his mortuary business because he's asked her to and he wants her close, she finds herself back in the town where she never quite got over her mother's betrayal and the gossip that followed her death. On top of that the boy turned man she's competed against from elementary school through high school is also back after a stint in

the Marines and has opened up his own mortuary business that is direct competition for her father's business. After taking her virginity all those years ago he's now out to ruin her father's business and while she can't let that happen she also can't deny the attraction she feels for him.

Finn Donovan feels like his life is finally on track. He's back home, he's opened a business that while isn't booming is beginning to make a name for itself, and he's finally gotten his mother out of clutches of his abusive father. Then she comes back to town; the one girl that knows his secret, the one that challenged him his whole life and made him a better Marine because of it, the one woman he find himself utterly attracted to, and the one woman he should stay far away from after he gets her father's business.

I found this book so very interesting because the hero and heroine had such a different view on their past life together and their one sexual encounter. Ellie always saw Finn as an adversary and then as the boy who used her and left. Finn appreciated the way their competition kept his mind off his horrific home life and made him want more. He remembered their one night together with fondness and the feeling that someone actually cared about him. Over the course of their book, they began to see each other in all kinds of new ways and not all of them good but all of them very real. They both are forced to deal with things in their past that have hurt them and through it all they manage to build a friendship that turns into more.

This book touched my soul as I too have a loved one stricken with Alzheimer's and the way it robs you of the person you've loved all of your life. I appreciate the way it was handled and felt the heroine's actions and feelings were very well written. I enjoyed this story despite the many tears I shed because if anything this disease teaches us it's to live each day as it's your last, let go of the past, and make memories now while you can.
